Ross Harriers Finish Second In District Meet At B.G.

Ross high school's surprising cross country team climaxed its season by finishing runner-up to Mansfield in the district meet at Bowling Green Saturday morning.

Mansfield finished on top with 39 points. Fremont had 54, Marion 62, Toledo Wait 90, Ashland 131.

Coach John Titsworth described the victory as "extremely satisfactory" because the Little Giants finished ahead of Marion, which has been dominating cross country meets for several years.

Larry Hamilton, of Ashland, led the field with the time of 10:30.1. The course was more

than two miles long. Louis Butler, Marion, was second and Herb Smith, Mansfield, third.

Jim Hasselbach paced the Fremont squad by finishing fourth, while teammate Dick Stevens fifth. Others in the first 10, in order, were Bob Ferguson, Mansfield; Carl Burns, Marion, seventh; Dick Beal, Fremont, 8th; Bill Shaff, Mansfield, 9th, and John Evans, Mansfield, 10th. Tovia Tagamets, Fremont, was 20th, and Leland Zilles, Fremont, placed 22nd.

A total of seven teams had full squads. Fremont will take a 14-man squad to Columbus this week-end for the state meet.
