Tiller, W. Glover Win Ohio First Team Berths

Left Halfback Jim Tiller, Tackle Wes Glover, Quarterback Burdette (Beebe) Schneider, and Defensive End John Level were named Tuesday by coaches and sports writers to the annual Ohio All-State team, thereby bringing additional acclaim to Ross high school and its staff of grid coaches who tutored them.

Tiller, high-scoring senior speedster who came right up the ladder since his sophomore year in AP all-state teams, broke out on top with a choice first team position. Wes Glover, senior big tackle who made the Columbus "Chic" Harrier team last week, also was honored with a first team defense position.

Schneider, also a senior who worked exceptionally well at quarterback for the last two seasons in the 20 game win streak, was named to the third team defense. And John Level, junior newcomer from Jackson-Burgum was listed at end in honorable mention.

Still to be released are the International News Service poll, which will be announced Wednesday afternoon, and the United Press teams, release date unknown according to John Malcolm, sports editor of the Sandusky Star-Register-News.

Interpersed throughout the teams for AP are players from the Buckeye Conference and schools in this region. Names will be found in the adjoining column.

"But not this group. The boys and coaches went from 16 wins to 20 to keep the winning streak intact," he added in conclusion.

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP)—Recognition of gridiron greatness was won by the state's standouts today as The Associated Press announced its 1966 all-Ohio high school football team.

The selections, made with the aid of more than 400 coaches, sports editors and officials, are recognized as official by the Ohio High School Football Coaches' Assn.

A stalwart line, averaging 208 from end to end and almost six feet two inches in height, spearheads the offensive corps. Behind it is a backfield capable of running around or through, or passing over, most any defense.

Ito Grimsley, who led Canton McKinley to its second straight state championship, is the quarterback. A left-handed passer and cute as a magician on the option play, he scored a dozen touchdowns, passed for 11 others and booted 46 extra points. He has everything.

At halfback are Jim Tiller, star at Fremont Ross for four years, who tallied 30 touchdowns this year for a career total of 62, and Wayne Fontes of Canton McKinley, who counted 24 touchdowns and two extra points. The fullback is Troy's "B-Bomb," Bobby Ferguson, who romped for 21 touchdowns in nine all-winning games.

The backfield scored 635 points. Ferguson at 190 is the big man of the quartet, Tiller the smallest at 155, and Grimsley and Fontes being the same size at 5-11 and 175. The end positions went to Bob Williams of Canton McKinley and Leon Mitchell of Middletown, the former being the lone repeater from last year. Each is 6-2, and a defensive standout as well as a blocking, pass-catching threat.

James Tryer, Newark's 235-pound 6-4 giant, and Bill Bloomington of Marietta, 214 and 6-2, grabbed the tackle spots. At guard are Hamilton's Oscar Hauer, 265 and 6-2, and Gary Loftus of East Cleveland Shaw, Loftus is only 5-9 and 187, but has speed and tenacity to burn, is a straight-A student, blocked five punts and intercepted seven passes along with his offensive chores.

The center spot went to Curt Binkley, 6-1 and 225, of Alliance.

BUCKEYES WIN 100-0

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP)—Ohio State, flashing a record of two wins in two tries in the young basketball season, is looking to a highly-touted St. Louis in a game here Saturday night after trouncing Pittsburgh, 100 to 69. Monday night's tilt with the Steel City boys saw big Frank Howard pour in 29 points for the Bucks which came up with their highest point production at home against a non-conference foe.


