Ross romps in Relays

The first afternoon Fremont "Night" Relays was a banner day for Fremont Ross track teams. Both the boys and girls teams easily won the relays title in the first ever run at the new all-weather track at Ross.



FRED VANCE is well above the hurdles while helping Ross stretch its lead in the event. The Little Giants ran a 59.7 to win easily.

The Ross boys piled up an even 100 points to finish well ahead of runnerup Port Clinton's 73. Third went to Tiffin Columbian with 57.

The Ross girls team racked up 92 points while finishing ahead of Maumee's 57.

Little Giants boys team won the discus, long jump, 400-meter relay, shuttle hurdles and the 800-meter relay.

In the 400-meter relay event, the Little Giants foursome of Larry Lindsey, Tom Pendrey, Curtis Lee and Willis Gentry turned in the second fastest time in the state with a 44.6 clocking. Elyria West was caught in the same time but finished a strike behind in the event.

Gentry, Lindsey and Pendrey turned in a 60.2% to win the long jump with the threesome of Dennis Murray, John Armentrout and Galen Rhoades not far up to sail the discus 365-10 for the top spot in that event.

John Almaguer anchored the shuttle hurdles team that clicked off a 59.7. Fred Vance, Greg Brown and Gregg Heden made up the remainder of the team.

Eric Gant, Lindsey, Lee and Gentry ran a 1:33.0 in winning the 800 relay.

In the girls action, Ross swept to seven firsts, one of them on a school record-breaking high jump by Amy Lindstrom.

Lindstrom leaped 5-1 to easily outdistance the old mark of 4-10.

Lindstrom also teamed with Donna Hetrick and Laurie Smith to win the shot put with a 36-3.

In the long jump, Tanja Tucker, Judy Shetzer and Jodi Price won with a 47-0. Tracy Groot, Laurie Smith and Margaret Van Gilder, won the discus with a 282-10 effort and Tammy Haas, Kim Lenz, Emma Almaguer and Debra Clark won the 3200 mile relay with a 10:43.6.

Price and Shetzer then joined Arlene Long and Tammy Haas to win the hurdles, and Tucker, Long, Haas and Amy Swope won the sprint medley.

Of the three events Ross didn't win they copped two seconds and a third.

Trophies for the relays were donated by Thurston-Zwir post of the American Legion.

Camelback Warm-Up will be Saturday

A Camelback Warm-Up will be Saturday, April 28, at the Ross High School all-weather track.

Sponsored by the Fremont Elite Runners Club, the Warm-Up is a kickoff for The News-Messenger Camelback 10,000 meter race which will be held May 20.

At the Warm-Up, there will be a one-mile fitness and fun run and a three-mile prediction race.

The one-mile run will begin promptly at 10 a.m. with the three-mile event to follow immediately afterwards.

Sign-up for the runs will begin at 9:30 a.m.

There is NO ENTRY FEE for the Warm-Up but there will be prizes given to runners.

The first two men and the first woman in the prediction race will receive free T-shirts and registration in The Camelback 10,000.

People in the prediction run will predict how long it will take them to run the three-mile distance. The people closest to that prediction time will be the winners.

The Warm-Up is geared especially for The Camelback 10,000 but all runners, regardless if they intend to run in the May 20 race, are welcome at the Warm-Up.

Cavs' low marks

RICHFIELD, Ohio (AP) — The Cleveland Cavaliers, who just finished their worst season in five years, also finished near the bottom of the National Basketball Association in attendance. Among the 22 NBA teams, only the New Jersey Nets drew fewer people to their home games than the Cavaliers.

Cleveland finished with a total attendance of 1,616,000, while New Jersey drew 2,000,017 to its temporary home at Rutgers University in Piscataway.
