Harding, Maumee win Fremont Relays titles

Marion Harding won six of 12 events to walk away with the boys portion of the 22nd Fremont Invitational Relays Saturday.

Maumee took the girls trophy, winning four events in the closely knotted race.

Harding rolled up 85 points to shade Port Clinton, second with 80. Third belonged to Maumee while Ross was fourth with 52, eight points out of third. Tiffin Columbia was fifth with Bowling Green and Oak Harbor tying for sixth and Oregon Clay finished on the bottom to round out the other team finishes.

Harding won the long jump, shuttle hurdles, sprint medley, 400, 800 and 1600 meter relays. Port Clinton took the pole vault, high jump and the 3200 meter event. Tiffin Columbian won the shot put and the discus while Maumee took the distance medley.

Ross finished second in the long jump, pole vault, 400 and 800 meter relays.

In the long jump, the team of Tony Gant, Ron Thrun and Ed DeMars turned in a 59-feet, 1-inch effort to finish behind the Harding team. Gant, the Buckeye Conference long jump champ, leaped 22-8 but fouled on another leap and scratched on the other. He was hampered by a pinched nerve in his neck.

Later, straining to catch Harding's Robert Pittman on the final leg of the 400 meter relay, Gant suffered a light muscle pull in his thigh. He did not compete after that.

Ross's 800 team was made up of Eric Bates, Rick Heidelberg, Jock Hicks and Robert Crawford. The pole vaulters were Ty Heslet, Steve Slatter and Doug Zink. Besides Gant on the 400 team, were Bates, Heidelberg and Hicks.

"It was a pretty good meet for us," Ross Coach Norm Bray said but added, "except for all those nagging little injuries we had."

"Outside of that, I was disappointed with the distance runners."

Besides Gant's injury, Bray was working lineups around to replace sprinter Mark Balsizer and hurdler Steve Tome, both out with injuries.

In the girls meet, Maumee tallied 73½ to runnerup Oak Harbor's 51. Third went to Tiffin Columbian at 43 while finishing fourth was Bowling Green with 40. Port Clinton, Oregon Clay, Ross and Marion Harding rounded out the field.

Maumee accounted for one record, turning in a combined effort of 304-feet, 7-inches in the discus, wiping out Ross's record of 282-10 set in 1979.

Tiffin Columbian's team of Sharon Widman, Stacie Sponseller and Denise Turned high jumper 14-8 to beat Bowling Green's 1979 mark by three inches.

Oak Harbor shattered the 800 meter record of 1:50.7 set by Maumee in 1979 with a 1:49.49. The team was comprised of Jacki Harder, Michele Burmeister, Tammy Gackstetter and Cindy Kern.

Bowling Green's 1600 meter team ran to a 4:12.72 clocking to erase the record of 4:20.0 set by Maumee in 1979.

Ross pulled off a mild surprise by winning the long jump. Darlene Starks, Beth Randolph and Lisa Luman turned in a 42-7 mark to nip Oregon Clay.

"We are coming along," Coach Harold Zienta said. "The girls are improving."

The Lady Little Giants' distance medley team of Randolph, Katie Marritt, Dorothy Pitts and Doris Clark finished second with a 14:39.31, 10 seconds behind Maumee.

Oak Harbor's 400 meter team of Harder, Michele Alexander, Gackstetter and Kern won the event in 52.68.
