Ross, Clyde Wrestlers In State Meet; Giants Defend In District Swim

District wrestling champion Fremont Ross sent nine boys to the State wrestling tourney in St. John Arena, Columbus today and Clyde sent along four boys.

In swimming, Ross high defends its District swimming title tonight in the Bowling Green State university pool, Bowling Green.

Coach Mal Mackey and Assistant Pete Michaels took the following District winners and runnerups to the state wrestling meet today: Champions Reuben Rendon, 112 pounds; George Shanahan, 127; Jim Otermat, 165; and Heavyweight Dick Swedersky and Runnerups Jim Ayers, 120; Paul Overmyer, 133; Neil Schneider, 145; Dan Coleman, 154; Tom Woessner, 175.

Clyde's John Ladd took one District champion to the state, undefeated (10-0) junior Cliff Perin, 154 and three runnerups, Charles Shaul, 103; Denny Sherck, 138; and Jerry Kaster, heavyweight.

All of the wrestlers will be in action either this afternoon or tonight to qualify for Saturday's afternoon semifinals. Finals are scheduled Saturday night.

Ross high swim team, under Co-Coaches Bill Faunce and Don Kepler, have won the District swim title the past two years.

Teams competing in BGSU pool tonight are Fremont Ross, Sandusky, Lima Senior, Mansfield and Findlay. Meet is expected to feature a team battle between Ross and Sandusky for District swimming honors.

Each team is allowed to enter four boys in each individual event. The best three boys from the five competing schools in

events tonight (meet gets underway at 7:30 tonight) will qualify for the State swimming tourney next Friday and Saturday in the Ohio State university pool, Columbus.

Talbot, Tod Set Records

11 Giant Swimmers Qualify For State

Fremont Ross wrapped up its 17th Northwest Ohio District swimming title, third in a row for the Little Giant splashers Friday night in the Bowling Green State university pool.

Two Ross swimmers set new District records and one tied a District mark. Ross qualified 11 boys for next weekend's State swimming meet in the Ohio State university pool, Columbus.

Point totals: Fremont Ross 91, Sandusky 73, Lima 52, Mansfield 33, Findlay 11. One Lima swimmer set a new District record.

Jack Talbot of Fremont set a new District record in the 150-yard individual medley and tied the 100-yard District backstroke mark. Gordon Tod of Ross set a new District standard in the 100-yard free style. Bob Hunter of Lima set a new district record in the 100-yard butterfly.

Co-Coaches Bill Faunce and Don Kepler of Ross gambled on a lineup arrangement in order to

defeat Sandusky and the chance worked. Both coaches were pleased with the Ross performances last night and in some cases surprised by a better showing than expected.

First four boys in each event go to the state meet. For Ross, state tournament-bound are Tod in the 50 free style and 100 free; John Schaaf in the 50 free; Jim Streeter in the 200 free and individual medley; Bill Wensinger in the 200 free; Talbot in the 100 backstroke and individual medley; John Myers in the 100 free; Mike Cochran in the 100 breaststroke; Lynn Huffman in the breaststroke; Tom Trout in diving (returns as state diving champion); and both Ross relay teams go to the state including 200 medley (John Roush, Huffman, Cochran, Trout) and 200 free style (Wensinger, Dave Parker, Schaaf and Myers).
