2000 Fremont Ross Graduate

Reggie Jones is celebrated for his exceptional talent and contributions to basketball and track and field. A versatile and driven athlete, Reggie earned six varsity letters and left an impact on the school's athletic history.

Both sports are sprinkled with records held by the outstanding athlete. In basketball, Jones is the all-time leading rebounder, with 544 boards. Not only did Jones receive four varsity letters in basketball, but he also attained All-Ohio honors during his junior and senior seasons. He was only the second in Ross's history to score 1,000 points during his time with the program.

Jones' excellence continued at the high jump pit during track season, where he earned two varsity letters. Reggie holds the high jump record at Ross, soaring to 6'9 " and becoming a state qualifier, showcasing his athletic versatility and strength.

Mark Gedeon
Accomplishments

1995-2018

Mark Gedeon served in many roles during his time with the Fremont Ross Boys Basketball program, but none as important as the head varsity coach from 1995-2018. During that time, Gedeon earned the most wins in program history with 246 victories. Those wins included four league championships, six sectional championships, and one district championship. After stepping down in 2018, Gedeon stayed on as the varsity assistant coach, assisting current head coach John Cahill until 2023.

In the classroom, Gedeon taught Mathematics at the high school for 28 years. He taught AP Calculus, Pre-Calculus, Geometry, and Algebra. He also served as the faculty manager from 2007 to 2012.

Mark's dedication to athletics and academics has left a lasting impact on the Fremont Ross Community.

Hall of Fame Inductee

Jeff Joerg's coaching career at Ross High School has left an indelible mark on the school and its athletes. Serving as the head coach for the 7th, 8th, and 9th grade football teams from 1970 to 1977, Coach Joerg led his teams to an impressive record of **31-17**, a **65% win rate**, and never had a losing season. His leadership was unmatched, culminating in a **perfect 6-0 undefeated season**, making him the only Junior High Coach to achieve such a feat.

Throughout his tenure, Coach Joerg's influence extended beyond the football field, as he also coached Junior High Swim. His dedication to his athletes and his ability to mentor and guide young players was evident in the success of his teams and the numerous accolades earned during his career. His legacy includes **14 Football Hall of Fame inductees**, a testament to his ability to shape future stars of the sport.

Beyond his coaching career, Coach Joerg was an outstanding educator, teaching **Ohio History** for 30 years and earning widespread recognition for his contributions in the classroom. Among his honors were the prestigious **Crystal Apple Award** from the Learning and Liberty Foundation, the **Jennings Teaching Scholarship**, and recognition as a **Golden Apple Finalist** by Marathon.

Pamela (Pitts) Fuqua

Years at Ross: 1984 – 1986

Outstanding Accomplishments and Contributions

Pamela Fuqua, a proud 1986 graduate of Fremont Ross, stands as a shining example of excellence in both athletics and leadership. Her outstanding athletic achievements, combined with her enduring contributions to Ross High School's legacy, truly warrant recognition. Not only did Pamela exemplify the peak of athleticism during her time at Ross, but she also paved the way for future generations of female athletes.

Fuqua discovered her passion on the track during her high school years. A four-year letter winner, she set and held records in the 100 and 200-meter dashes. Fuqua also contributed as the anchor leg for both the 4x100 and 4x200 relay teams. Pamela's 100m and 200m records stood for 15 years before being surpassed by fellow athlete Fallon Bailey, whom Pamela later coached.

Beyond her accomplishments at Ross, Pamela's impact was felt far and wide. In 1986, she was named the MVP of the NAACP team, a testament to her leadership and talent. That same year, she achieved extraordinary success at the Junior Olympics held in the Fiji Islands, where she won both the 100m and 200m races and contributed to the winning 400m and 800m relay teams.

Pamela has also given back to the sport by serving as an assistant track coach, further shaping the athletes who followed in her footsteps.

Hall of Fame Inductee

2005 Fremont Ross graduate

Adam Wilhelm's remarkable athletic career is a testament to his dedication, talent, and outstanding achievements across multiple sports. A four-time letter winner in Track and field, a two-year letterman in Soccer, and a one-year letterman in Football, Adam's contributions to his teams and school are legendary.

In Track & Field, Adam set school records in the **400m** (48.1 seconds), **4x400m relay**, and **4x200m relay**, impacting the program. He also posted an impressive **200m time of 21.7 seconds**, showcasing his versatility and speed. His incredible accomplishments extended to the football field, where he averaged 30 yards per catch and scored 5 touchdowns.

Following his high school success, Adam excelled at **Ohio State University**, where he earned a letter in Track and field, solidifying his legacy as one of the greatest athletes to come through the program.
