THIRD CONSECUTIVE TITLE

Findlay In Class By Itself In Buckeye Conference Golf

The Fremont Country Club course played long to everybody but Findlay golfers Monday in the Buckeye Conference golf tournament. Findlay amassed a 49-stroke margin with a 310-stroke total in winning its third consecutive conference championship.

Only four boys in the field of 24 golfers shot 80 or below and all four were playing for Findlay. Mike Strathman, who fired a three-over-par 75, repeated as conference championship medalist. A year ago at Findlay Country Club he led the field with a 74.

Strathman was closely followed by teammates. Scott Hugus, who fired a 77, and Tom Beagle with a 78. Tom Norris, Findlay number one man who was Buckeye medalist as a sophomore in 1964, had a two-stroke penalty for playing the wrong ball and ended up with an 80.

Next lowest in the field to the Findlay foursome were Ross' Bill Wingard and Mansfield's Harry Waldman with rounds of 83.

While there was a 49-stroke difference between number one and number two teams, only six strokes separated the other five teams in the field. Marion placed second with a 359 total and last was Fremont Ross at 365. Other scores were Sandusky, 360; Elyria, 362, and Mansfield, 363.

York Eliminates St. Joseph In Sectional Opening Game

CLYDE — It was a short walk on the tournament trail for St. Joseph Monday as their bats were silent and their gloves slippery. Stroking only one hit and committing eight errors the Crimson Streaks fell in the opener of the Class A Sectional at Clyde to York, 6-2.

Second game of the sectional is scheduled for the Clyde diamond tonight. It will match Woodville and Lakeside. York will have its next outing against Gibsonburg Wednesday. Finals of the sectional with the winner advancing to Bettsville will be played Friday.

Chris Perrin was the winning pitcher for York, working five and two-thirds innings. The only hit yielded by Perrin was a single from the bat of Dennis Miesle. Perrin struck out six, walked

five and allowed no runs in five and two-thirds innings.

Bob McGrady worked the other one and one-third inning, giving up two unearned runs to St. Joseph.

Five of the six York runs were unearned as the Streak fielders had trouble handling the ball.

The initial York run came in the first inning on a hit batsman, a groundout to the pitcher advancing the runner to second, an error and a single by Mike Hartley driving in the run.

The margin of victory was supplied in the three-run fourth inning. York tallied three times on the combination of three St. Joseph errors, a fielder's choice, flyout and singles by Perrin and Hartley.
