Giants take first step in GLL chase

LaFountain returns five lettermen as tennis team aims to dethrone Findlay

The Fremont Ross boys tennis team took a vital step toward a league showdown with Findlay by downing Napoleon, 4-1, Tuesday in the Little Giants' home opener.

Ross (2-0) won two singles and two doubles matches in its first Great Lakes League match at Rodger Young Park.

"This was a crucial win for us heading into the GLL tournament," Ross head coach Rick LaFountain said. "With two league losses, you can pretty much forget about the title. We knew we had to win this one with Findlay still ahead in the schedule. It was a huge win for us."

Ross's David Albrechta rolled to a 6-1, 6-3 triumph over Ben Bischoff at first singles. Teammate Justin Orofino eked out a 6-4, 5-7, 7-6 (7-1) victory over Matt Hase at third singles.

At first doubles, Chris Orofino and Nick Mitikki of Ross pulled off a 6-2, 6-2 win over Ben Geppert and Matt Price. Drew Wetzel and Aaron Gray cruised to a 6-2, 6-0 victory over Dan Bauer and Kyle Rosebuck at second doubles.

Mitikki, an exchange student from Thailand, normally will play at second singles. But he moved to doubles Tuesday because of a sore ankle.

Napoleon's only win came at second doubles. Adam Fausey earned a 6-2, 6-2 triumph over Adam Gibbs. It was the Wildcats' season opener.

LaFountain enters his eighth season at Ross with an experienced crew that features five returning letterwinners. The Little Giants went 11-4 (4-1

GLL) and lost singles players Marc Brough and Paul Eckert and doubles player Adam Swope to graduation. Brough and Eckert advanced to district as a doubles team.

Albrechta, a junior, moves into the top singles spot. He was 18-8 last season.

Mitikki will be in the second singles spot, and Gibbs, who went 16-9 last season, mans the third position.

The Orofinos will team up at first doubles after going 15-9 as a duo last year. Wetzel will join one of three players in the second doubles spot. Juniors Aaron Gray and Anthony Weiker and senior Justin Berger are vying for the final spot.

The Little Giants are diving right into their season. After beating Tiffin Columbian and Napoleon to begin the campaign, Ross faces state-title con-

tender Elida and Huron yet this week.

"We will find out how good we are the first week of the season," LaFountain said before the season began. "We have a real tough schedule this year. Hopefully, that will get us ready for the tournament, but we're taking it one match at a time. Our first goal is winning the GLL."

Ross and Findlay are expected to battle for the league title. The Trojans are trying to defend their three consecutive titles with a veteran squad.

"It's going to come down to us and Findlay. They've always been our rival," LaFountain said. "We won the league from 1997-99, and Findlay's won it from 2000-02. We're hoping to get that turned around and get our string going again."
