Ross Gym Site Of Much Activity: **21 Wrestling Teams In District Tourney**

Fremont Ross gym this weekend will rock with grunts, groans and cheers as 21 high schools bring wrestling teams to participate in the annual Northwestern Ohio District Wrestling tournament. There will be 225 boys vying for 11 berths at the state tourney the following week.

Action starts Friday at 2 p.m. with the first and second round preliminaries being held. Wrestlers pick up again at 7 p.m. Friday when the quarter-finals will be held. By the end of Friday's heavy activity, 180 bouts will have been concluded.

Saturday's semi-finals start at 3:30 with 22 bouts scheduled. Finals are at 7 p.m. when another 22 bouts are run off, leaving only the 11 district winners remaining.

Ross 'Larry Kelly (127) and Glen Haas (138) went to the state tournament in 1963. Frank Slessman of Clyde also made the state trip.

Following schools will make up what is described as 'the biggest tournament ever held in Fremont': Ross, St. Joe, Clyde, York, Lakota, Bellevue, Port Clinton, Ashland, Huron, Arcadia, Castalia, Crestline, Fostoria, Milan, Mansfield, Madison, Mansfield Malabar, Mansfield Senior, Mohawk, Ontario, Sandusky and Vermilion.

Huron is the defending district champion, winning easily with a total of 93 points. Fremont was runner - up with 59. Mansfield Madison placed third, Clyde fourth, Ashland fifth, Fostoria sixth, Mansfield Senior seventh and St. Joe eighth.

Huron has three champions returning in heavier weight classes. Ashland has one back.

Huron Leads Ross By One In Wrestling

Huron, defending district wrestling champion, is holding on to a slim one point lead over last year's runner-up, Fremont Ross, today after a heavy preliminary round Friday at Ross gym.

A total of 180 bouts were cleared in afternoon and evening sessions. There are now 44 wrestlers remaining for the 11 berths to next weekend's state meet.

Huron has 26 points, Ross 25, Clyde 19, St. Joe 17 and down the list Lakota has eight. Huron won in 1963 with 93 points. Fremont trailed with 59. Twenty-one schools, consisting of 225 boys, entered the tournament.

Today's semi-final round begins at 3:30 and the finals are slated for 7:30.

The eight Ross high lads who are still alive include Bruce Norton, 103 - pounds; Gary Meggitt, 112; Chuck Scharte, 120; Mike Frantz, 133; Jim Marinis, 145; George Branco, 154; Ed Smith, 175; and Dick Nitschke, heavyweight.

St. Joe has two boys remaining in competition. They are Dick Ready, 130, and Ron Gibson, 154.

Clyde has three still fighting: Merrill Smith, 127, Tom Miller, 165, and Frank Perrin, 175.

Lakota has two boys still in. They are Leroy Coleman, 127, and Earl Sleek, 138.

Two years ago, Ross edged Huron for the district championship by one point. Fremont has a good chance of winning the title again as Huron has one less boy in the final two rounds.

Nitschke won all three of his matches by pins.

Three defending champions are still in. They are Ashland's Stew Ferguson, 145, and Huron's Doug Wentz, 112, and Ron Shape, 138.

An estimated crowd of 1,200 watched the activity.

Huron Tops Fremont In District Meet

Huron high school repeated as district wrestling champions here Saturday night and Fremont Ross once again finished second in the team standings.

Local boys to emerge as district winners and ready to cast their lot in the state tournament this weekend in Columbus are Ross' Mike Frantz, 133 - pound class, Frank Perrin, Clyde's 175-pounder, and Dennis Pursell, 127, of Port Clinton.

Fremont wrestlers took a host of second places and wound up with 72 points. Huron won with 93 points, the same figure it garnered last season in winning.

Following were Clyde 44, Sandusky 33, Mansfield Senior 32, Ashland 31, Port Clinton 26, Mohawk 26, Fremont St. Joe 23, Vermilion 22, Fostoria 20, Mansfield Madison 18, Lakota 14, Arcadia 8, Castalia 8, Ontario 8, Crestline 7, Mansfield Malabar 2, Milan 1, York nothing and Bellevue nothing.

In order to win a state wrestling title a boy must win four matches, two in Friday's preliminaries and two Saturday.

Huron will send two former

state champions back to Columbus, Doug Wentz, 112, and John Sharpe, 145.

Ross' places in the finals were as follows:

Bruce Norton, 103, second; Gary Meggett, 112, second; Chuck Scharte, 120, second; Jim Marinis, 145, third; George Branco, 154, fourth; Ed Smith, 175, fourth; and Dick Nitschke, heavyweight, second.

St. Joe's Dick Ready was fourth in the 103-pound weight and Ron Gibson was third in 154.

Clyde's Merrill Smith was second in 127 and Tom Miller second in 165. Lakota's Leroy Coleman was fourth in 127 and Earl Sleek was third in 138.


