# 18 Schools Entered

## District Wrestling Tourney

### Friday, Saturday At Ross

Eighteen high schools are entered in the big district wrestling tournament set for Ross high gym Friday and Saturday, John Titsworth, faculty manager, announced Friday.

Titsworth went on to say that he believes this will be the largest district wrestling tournament in northwest Ohio, and it probably

will be the largest district event staged here in the past 20 years.

The tournament opens Friday at 2 p.m. and continues that night. Wrestlers return to action Saturday at 10:30 a.m. and compete until dinner time. Action picks up again at 3 p.m. Saturday and will end around 5 p.m. Ross and Toledo Woodward are scheduled to play basketball at the high school starting at 6:30 p.m.

Teams entered are Fremont Ross, Fremont St. Joseph's, Arcadia, Ashland, Castalia Margaretta, Clyde, Fostoria, Huron, Lakota, Mansfield Madison, Mansfield Senior, Mohawk-Sycamore, Ontario, Sandusky, Vermilion, Bellville, Port Clinton and Milan.

Seventeen wrestlers are registered to compete in the 103, 112, 127 and 165-pound classes. The 120, 133, 138, 145, 154 and 175-pound classes will carry 18 wrestlers. Fifteen matmen are set to go in the heavyweight division.

# Joseph, Starr To Represent Ross In State Mat Meet

Curt Joseph and Ralph Starr earned themselves a berth in the state wrestling meet two weeks from now with their victories in the district wrestling tournament held at Ross gym Saturday.

Joseph won in the 103-pound di-

vision and Starr took the 112-pound class.

Ross also won the team title with 67 points, barely edging a strong Clyde crew and Huron, both finishing with 66 points. Sandusky was third with 53 points and Mansfield Madison had 50. Other schools and their finishes were Ashland, 41; Mansfield, 31; Fostoria, 22; Margaretta, 21; Arcadia, 16; St. Joe, 14; Mohawk, nine; Vermilion, five; Ontario four; Port Clinton and Bellevue, three each; and Lakota and Milan, one each.

Ross entered the final two rounds with seven qualifiers. Clyde event in with six and St. Joe had two. The Fliers came through with four second place finishes. Chuck Shaul, Jeff Pump, Bob Vargus and Frank Slessman were the Clyde wrestlers who came close to going to the state meet.

## Ross Wrestlers End Year On Top - District Title

The year 1962 has been a good one for Ross' wrestling squad. After blowing hot and cold through several dual meets during the "meat" part of their regular slate, the Little Giants capped the campaign with the district championship, a narrow 67-point triumph over 17 other schools. Clyde and Huron followed closely with 66 points.

Another feather in the Giants' hats was the showing of two lightweight performers, Curt Joseph and Ralph Starr, both state bound next week as a result of their district victories. Joseph won in the 103-pound class and Starr took the 112-pound title.

Ross entered the final two rounds of the district tourney with seven qualifiers. They were in addition to Joseph and Starr, Mike Frantz, Larry Kelly, Bill Thraves, John Deno and Ken Smith. Frantz placed second in the finals.

Mal Mackey and Pete Michaels served as coaches of the Ross mat crew, and while Mackey was ill Michaels stepped in to fill the job as head grappler.

Felix Palomo, who failed to make the semi-finals, was Ross' leading winner with 14 triumphs, three losses and a tie. Starr was next with a 13-4 record. Joseph was beaten in only three matches out of 15 and Glenn Haas and

Bill Thraves each won 12 times. Frantz posted a 10-7-2 record, Kelly was 11-2-1, Deno finished 10-5 and Ken Smith was 4-5.
