Lynch, Aseltine qualify for districts

Bettsville's Brittany Lynch and Torrey Aseltine of Fremont Ross each advanced to the district golf tournament Tuesday.

Lynch carded an 87 (41-46) to finish the 70-girl sectional tournament at Green Hills as runner-up.

"For Brittany to make it back to districts this year shows how hard she worked all year," said Bettsville golf coach Jeff Lynch, Brittany's father. "The sectional has 26 schools and with only one division in girls golf, it's quite an accomplishment. Last year she missed going to state by only a couple shots — anything can happen."

Aseltine fired an 89 (45-44) for one of the other four spots to advance.

"We're very, very excited for Torrey," said Little Giant coach Mark Miesle. "We put her through the ringer playing with the boys the majority of the season. When it came time to play with the girls, she was tournament tough and ready to deal with this."

Districts are Tuesday at Sycamore Springs Golf Course in Arlington.

Brittany's sister Jessica finished one stroke back of Aseltine to narrowly miss advancing.

Miesle said Aseltine does not feel additional pressure

with talented brother Andrew on the team and father Chris a club professional at Fremont Country Club.

"That's a huge plus," Miesle said. "With her dad the professional at the country club she can play 24/7 if she wishes and she can observe what Andrew does well and possibly emulate that. It's nothing but a positive."

Aseltine, a sophomore, did not play golf last year.

"She got a lot better from the beginning of the year, mainly because she was cut no slack," Miesle said. "She had to compete against the boys from Day 1, and knowing that was the case, she knew she'd have to get better. It was a good experience for her."

Oak Harbor's Nichole Woggon also advanced to districts out of the Green Hills qualifier in Clyde.
