The Ross girls are now 3-0.

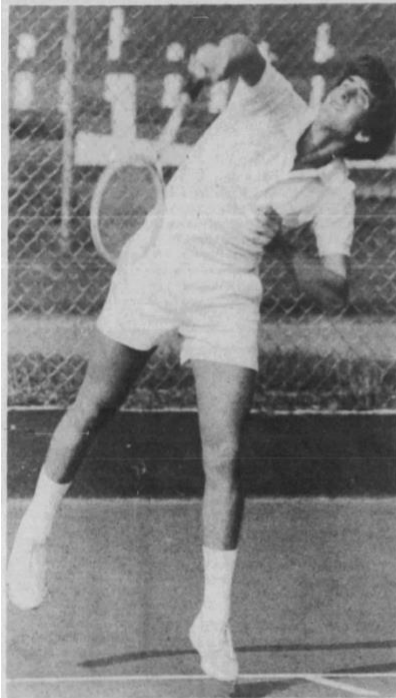


Ross girls undefeated

Capital tough foe for Heidelberg

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) — Surprising Capital, a five-time loser in nine games last fall, now crops up as a rugged 1973 test for Heidelberg, carrying Ohio's longest college football streak of 17 games.

However, veteran Capital Coach Gene Slaughter prefers to do a sell job on the defending Ohio Conference champions.

"They're one of the premier small college teams in the nation," said Slaughter, "and among the best ever that I've seen in the Ohio Conference."

Capital (3-0) and Heidelberg (4-0) meet at Capital in one of five games that open the Ohio Conference season Saturday. They are two of the contenders in the Red Division.

Another Red Division power, unbeaten Wittenberg, plunges into conference competition at home against Baldwin-Wallace. The Tigers also are 4-0 this fall.

Wooster is at Mount Union in the third game in the Red Division. In the Blue Division, Denison plays at Ohio Wesleyan and Marietta at Otterbein.

The OC action is part of a 23-game Ohio college schedule that sends Ohio State, top-ranked nationally, to Wisconsin in a

home against Anderson (1-1). Wilmington is at Defiance in another H-BC test.

The lone Presidents Conference game sends Bethany to Hiram.

Elsewhere, Findlay is at Muskingum, Kenyon at Case Western Reserve, Oberlin at Georgetown, Akron at Northern Michigan, Ashland at Central State, John Carroll at Grove City (Pa.), Hillsdale at Ohio Northern and Eastern Illinois at Youngstown State (night).
