

Baron, Garcia State Champs

Fremont has a brand new kind of championship today.

The unbeaten duo of Jack Baron and Dick Garcia brought home the state doubles championship in tennis Saturday afternoon after a hard fought victory in the finals.

It is the first tennis title for Ross as well as the first state championship in any sport other than swimming.

Baron and Garcia waded through two sets of opponents Friday. On Saturday morning, they defeated Dave Buss and John Oetennger of Cincinnati Walnut Hills, 6-4, 6-3.

Lose First Set

That put them in the finals against Pat Arnold and Mac Mafette, of Middletown. The Ross team, which advanced to the state semi-finals last season, lost the first set, 6-4, but rallied brilliant-

ly to win the next two sets, 6-3 and 6-4.

Meanwhile, the state singles championship was again won by Barry McKay, of Dayton Oakwood. He successfully defended his title with an extended win over John Brownlow of Euclid Brush, 9-7, 6-8, 6-3.

Both Baron and Garcia have been outstanding members of the Giants' net squad since their sophomore years. Baron has one more year of competition, while Garcia, who captained the basketball team last winter and made the All-Buckeye League in that sport, is a senior. Baron was also a tennis regular.

Baron was unbeaten in singles during the regular season this year and may go after the state singles title next season.
