## Scribe-Rated Clubs Doing Okay In Ohio High Basketball Tourneys

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP)—The top-talent teams picked by Ohio's sports writers are doing well, thank you, in the upset-filled sectional high school basketball tournaments now under way.

All the top 10 Class AA quintets picked by the scribes in the final Associated Press poll are still around, as well as nine of the 10 leaders in Class A. Only Sabina's seventh-ranked club has bowed out.

Two of last year's state finalists, Midvale in Class A and Kent Roosevelt in Class AA, were ushered to the sidelines Thursday night. Midvale was ousted by Gnadenhutten in the Dover sec-

tional, 80-67, while Kent Roosevelt was victimized 62-36 by Akron North at the Kent sectional.

Of last year's Class AA title cast, defending champion Middletown, Toledo Macomber and Cleveland Cathedral Latin are still in competition, but little Bethel High School of Marr, Monroe County, is the only one of the elite quartet left in Class A.

Bethel won its 20th in 21 starts Thursday night at Marietta, dumping Summerfield 77-51.

Four of the Class AA top 10 were winners in Thursday's games. Salem (No. 5) make it 19 straight with a 65-57 win over Youngstown East; Zanesville (3) won over Cambridge 55-23, Cincinnati St. Xavier (7) was a nifty 93-54 winner over Western Hills, and Hamilton (9) trimmed Hamilton Catholic 76-59. Only Hamilton of that batch of talent has been beaten.

Bethel is rated third among Class A teams. Dixie of Montgomery County (8), won its 22nd in a row over Bowersville-Jefferson 76-

The Ohio high school tournament trail gets a little tougher this weekend for area basketball teams.

Tonight at Rossford Field House, game time 8 p. m., Fremont Ross (5-12) tackles Genoa (9-7) in the upper bracket final of the Rossford Class AA Sectional tournament. Tickets will be available at the Field House for those who haven't purchased them in advance.

Ross upset top-rated Perrysburg 49-47 in double overtime last Friday to advance to the upper championship game. Genoa's Comets whipped Oak Harbor 33-31 last Saturday.

Winner of the Ross vs Genoa game advances to next week's District tournament in Toledo.

# Advances To District With 48-38 Win Over

## Rebound Edge, Tight Defense Lead To Sectional Triumph; Level Leads Scoring With 19

ROSSFORD FIELD HOUSE — District tournament-bound Fremont Ross will carry an unspectacular 6-12 record but a newly-found desire and winning combination to Toledo next week where the Little Giants will battle two Toledo clubs and either Bowling Green or Clay for a Regional berth.

Co-captains Mark Walter and John Level accepted the upper bracket Rossford Sectional Class AA trophy from E. E. Andrews, tourney manager here last night following the Giants' 48-38 triumph over Clay-Genoa high school.

Tonight at 8 p. m. at Rossford, Bowling Green and Toledo Clay tangle for the lower bracket trophy and a trip to the Toledo District. One other District entry besides Ross was decided Friday night, unbeaten Toledo Scott barely managing to get by underdog Woodward 29-23. Central Catholic and DeVilbiss clash tonight in Toledo for the other District berth.

Ross high's double overtime victory over Perryburg last week in its initial Sectional test and the win over Genoa last night marked the first back-to-back triumphs for the Little Giants this season since opening 1957-58 wins over Holland and Norwalk.

Coach Al Ziemke relied on his "substitute freely" formula to again achieve success in tournament competition. He worked in sophomores Steve Cecil, Roger Mann and Harry Walter, a starter, with veteran seniors Mark Walter, Level and Chuck Houdeshell plus juniors Mike McCarthy and Reuben Lozano to overpower Genoa's Comets.

Command of the backboards, ball control and an aggressive defense that forced Genoa to lose the ball on fumbled passes and Ross steals keynoted the Fremont success.

Both teams employed a slow, deliberate, cautious offense with neither club too effective from the field nor from the charity stripe. Ross made 19 field goals to 14 for Genoa and the Little Giants connected on 10 of 20 free tosses to 10 of 24 for the Comets. However, rebound control gave Ross a greater share of possession and thus a chance to hoist more field goal attempts.

Fremont was behind only briefly in the game, 2-0 when Howard

(Skip) Sidner tallied on a field and 6-3 center Lyn McCoil hit on a free toss to give Genoa a 3-0 edge. Level's jump shot and a set by Mark Walter put Ross on top 4-3. Vic Libbe tallied for Genoa to give the Comets their last lead. 5-4. Free throws by Houdeshell and Level and a basket by 5-7 guard Walter who drove in for a layup restored Ross high's advantage. 8-5. Two more jump shots by Level boosted Ross high's margin to 12-9 before McCoil jumped for a two-pointer with three seconds remaining in the quarter. Ross led 12-11 going into the second stanza.

### Lead At Halftime

Co-captains Walter and Level combined on a second quarter opening basket, Walter "feeding" and Level tallying on a jump shot as Ross moved in front 14-11. Sidner's long shot and a free throw by Tom Dwyer tied the score at 14-all. Houdeshell rebounded in a two-pointer for Ross and McCoil also tapped in a bucket for Genoa after missing his first try to knot the count at 16-16. Mark Walter's nifty drive in and lefty layup gave Fremont an 18-16 advantage. Fremont was never headed nor tied again, gaining a 25-20 edge at halftime.

Genoa outscored Ross 12-11 in the third stanza which found Ross still ahead at its close, 35-32. Houdeshell's rebounding and a pair of field goals by Level paced Fremont's persistent attack in the third chapter.

Ross continued to control the ball in the final eight minutes and, paced by Level and Houdeshell, managed to stay ahead of the desperate Comets.

### Easy Baskets

Trailing 42-35 at the 2:06 to play mark in the fourth quarter after Level's follow-up rebound, Genoa tried to pass Fremont. The tactics failed as first Cecil, then Houdeshell and finally Mark Walter broke loose for easy drives and layups to increase Ross high's edge to the final 48-point difference.

Level's 19 points and 10 by Mark Walter plus commanding rebounding by Level, Houdeshell and Cecil McCarthy and Lozano when they were seeing action led Ross high's assault.

Sidner, not too effective with his long range bombing, paced Genoa's scoring with 13 points. McCoil had only eight markers but he turned in a bright rebound job, the only Genoa member who held his own against the Little Giants under the boards. Mark Walter's dogged defending stifled Sidner who usually scores in the 20s.

Genoa bowed out with a 9-8 overall and 6-7 against AA foes record.

The Ross cagers were backed by one of their largest turnout of followers from Fremont.

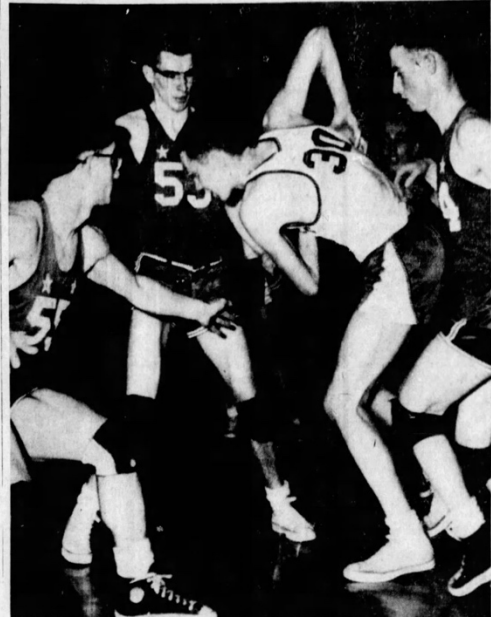

GIBSONBURG — Wood county's representatives in the Gibsonburg Class A Sectional tournament fell victim to Green Springs to Sandusky county and Elmore of Ottawa county in tussles here last night.

Springs, Sandusky county tournament champion, upped its record to 17-3 with a 42-34 triumph over Troy-Luckey, Wood county tournament runnerup. The victory advances Coach Bud Rutherford's Bobcats to the Tiffin District tourney next Friday and Saturday.

In the first game last night, Elmore, now 15-4, Ottawa county journey champ, won an overtime 61-55 verdict over Montgomery Wayne, Wood county tourney titlist.

Montgomery bowed out with a 19-55 record and Troy-Luckey with 14-7.

Elmore now battles host Gibsonburg (10-10) at 8 tonight in the Gibsonburg high school gymnasium to decide another entry in the Tiffin District meet.

The Bulldogs of Coach Chuck Rymer and the Golden Bears of Coach Bob Krotzer met each other twice during the regular season, both gaining a victory.

Springs trailed 23-24 entering the fourth quarter last night but gained the upperhand in the opening mo-

pressing tactics. However, with 3:15 to play and Springs ahead 34-29, Jerry Schrock, 6-2 junior guard of the Bobcats, fouled out. That's when 6-6 senior center Gary Young took over. The tall pivotman dunked three baskets and two free tosses to provide the Bobcats their edge.
