# CAMPBELL HAS HOPE OF TITLE

## Star Miler Entered in District Meet with Ross Tracksters

Wade (Soupy) Campbell, star mile runner and state cross country champion, will try for the district mile title Saturday at the Northwest District meet at Mansfield, where Coach Harold (Whitey) Althoff will have his cohorts in action.

Campbell will also be entered in the half mile event, the coach said. Campbell won the Buckeye league mile title last week at the conference meet at Findlay, setting a new record.

Sandusky is again favored to annex the district bunting, with Mansfield and Fremont in a stiff battle for second place. The first three men in each event automatically qualify for the state meet at Columbus in two weeks.

# LITTLE GIANTS NOSED OUT FOR SECOND PLACE

Several Qualify for State  
Event; Five Firsts Go  
to Fremont

Sandusky, Mansfield and Fremont Row dominated the Northwest Ohio district track and field meet at Mansfield last Saturday, and finished in that order in points scored.

The Blue Streaks ran up a total of 83 1/2 points, while Mansfield scored 64 1/2 to nose out the Ross Little Giants who tallied an even 60. Bellevue ended in fourth place with 13 points. Norwalk, fifth, eight, and Tiffin, sixth, five.

The Little Giants registered five first places, with Wade (Seely) Campbell, star distance runner, taking first in the mile run and in the 800-event. Campbell ran an easy mile to win without effort in 4:41, then came back to set a new district and school record in the 880-run, with a time of 2:03.3.

## Lewis in First

Joe Lewis leaped to a first place in the broad jump to gather points for Coach Harold Althoff's squad, while George Fresh tossed the javelin 170 feet 4 inches to capture first. Pete Fox also came in for laurels with a fine five feet 8 1/2 inch jump in the high jump.

As a result of the events in the district session, six Fremonters are eligible for competition in the state meet in two weeks. Lewis will appear in the broad jump, the medley relay and in the 100-yard dash. Campbell will run the mile and possibly the 880; Fox will be entered in the high jump and high hurdles, and Fresh will toss the javelin. Bud Kaufmann will be entered in the pole vault. Jim Spangler will join with Lewis in the medley relay, but trials will be held for the other two positions on the relay squad.

## High Point Men

High point scorers were: Campbell, 12; Lewis 11 1/2; and Fox 10, the three between them scoring half of Fremont's tallies.

Considerable complaint was heard over the officiating. Mansfield's mile relay team should have been disqualified for two false starts, but was allowed to run, thus depriving Fremont of second place in the meet. Two star Sandusky athletes were also disqualified, and the Blue Streaks protested violently over the officiating.
