CAMPBELL HAS HOPE OF TITLE

Star Miler Entered in District Meet with Ross Tracksters

Wade (Soupy) Campbell, star mile runner and state cross country champion, will try for the district mile title Saturday at the Northwest District meet at Mansfield, where Coach Harold (Whitey) Althoff will have his cohorts in action.

Campbell will also be entered in the half mile event, the coach said. Campbell won the Buckeye league mile title last week at the conference meet at Findlay, setting a new record.

Sandusky is again favored to annex the district bunting, with Mansfield and Fremont in a stiff battle for second place. The first three men in each event automatically qualify for the state meet at Columbus in two weeks.

LITTLE GIANTS NOSED OUT FOR SECOND PLACE

Several Qualify for State
Event; Five Firsts Go
to Fremont

Sandusky, Mansfield and Fremont Ross dominate the Northeastern District track and field meet at Mansfield last Saturday, and finished in that order in points scored.

The Blue Streaks ran up a total of 85½ points, while Mansfield received 83½ and Ross 80. The Little Giants who tallied an even 60, Bellevue ended in fourth place with 13 points; Norwalk, 11th, registered a total of five.

The Little Giants registered five first places, with Wade (Soupy) Campbell star distance runner, taking first in the 200 and 880-run at the 880-event. Campbell ran an easy mile to win without effort in 4:41.2, and was second in the 100-yard dash; Campbell will run a mile and 400 yards in the 880. Fox will be entered in the high jump and high hurdles, and Fred will toss the javelin. Lewis will compete in the pole vault. Jim Spangler will join with Lewis in the medley relay, but trials will be held for the other two positions on the relay squad.

Lewis in First
Joe Lewis took first place in the broad jump to gather points for Coach Harold Althoff's squad, while George Frech took the javelin throw, and Fred was to capture first. Pete Fox also came in for laurels with a fine five feet 8½ inch jump in the high jump.

As far as the events in the district session, six Fremonters are eligible for competition in the state meet. The first six districts will appear in the broad jump, the medley relay and in the 100-yard dash; Campbell will run a mile and 400 yards in the 880. Fox will be entered in the high jump and high hurdles, and Fred will toss the javelin. Lewis will compete in the pole vault. Jim Spangler will join with Lewis in the medley relay, but trials will be held for the other two positions on the relay squad.

High Point Meet
High point winners: Campbell, 12; Lewis 11½; and Fox 10, the three between them scoring half of Fremont's total.

One possible complaint was heard over the officiating. Mansfield's mile relay team should have been allowed to run two false starts, but was allowed to run, thus depriving Fremont of second place in the relay. The star Sandusky javelin was also disallowed, and the Blue Streaks protested violently over the officiating.
