Ross 'duals' for BCC title

Al Voggenthaler has said goodbye to the home folks; now he and his Fremont Ross wrestling team will bid adieu to the Buckeye Central Conference.

Voggenthaler, his rocking chair of retirement in place, will guide the Little Giants in the BCC meet at Findlay High School Saturday. Wrestling begins at 11 a.m.

Ross has won the meet — it is actually a quadrangular with Findlay, Lancaster and Newark — two of its three years. Zanesville does not have a wrestling team.

Wednesday, Voggenthaler was presented with a purple and white rocker, roughly hewn out of what appeared to be left-over lumber. It signalled his retirement from teaching and coaching. He has led the Little Giants since 1972, taking over from Mal Mackey, who began the wrestling program.

The biggest challenge facing Ross in his final conference tournament, Voggenthaler expects, is Newark.

"They have a 16-3 dual record," Voggenthaler said. "He (coach Bill Biggers) apparently has a lot of kids back, but a lot of the names are unfamiliar."

Ross, 7-1-1, will wrestle Findlay and Lancaster takes on Newark in the first of the duals. The next set will have Ross going against Lancaster and Findlay challenging Newark. Ross will face Newark in the third round as Lancaster takes on Findlay.

"The teams with the best re-

cords (prior to the tournament) wrestle last," Voggenthaler said. "Lancaster had a winning record — but I don't know what it is — and Findlay, I don't think has won a match."

One of the Findlay losses was a 61-7 thumping from Ross on a night when the Trojans forfeited four weight divisions.


"That normally does not happen to them," Voggenthaler said.

The team with the best overall record in the dual meets is declared the BCC champ. The same goes for determining the individual weight division winners. There are several ways to break a tie for both team and individuals such as head-to-head competition; total points; or most falls and/or technical falls. After that, it is a tie.

"We have been preparing all year for the state tournaments," Voggenthaler said, "and the BCC is a stepping stone toward them, but one of our goals is to win it."

Ross has three individual champions returning: Dave Boda (103), Brian Moreno (189) and Chad Green (275). All are expected to wrestle at those weights. Dave Alejandro was runner-up in the 112-pound division a year ago and will be at the same weight again.

The tentative Little Giants' lineup will have Boda at 103; Alejandro at 112; Mat Kanan at 119; Jaime Hernandez at 125; John Lugar at 130; Daniel Costilla at 135; Rodney Pettiford at 140; Lamar Shepard at 145; Jon Haney at 152; Andy Reardon at 160; Fred Schnee at 171; Moreno at 189 and Green at 275.




Ross wrestlers enter BCC duals

Little Giants keep BCC title

FINDLAY — A pair of wins and a draw offset an upset as Fremont Ross defeated Newark 30-28 to clinch the Buckeye Central Conference Wrestling Tournament championship Saturday.

The victory over the Wildcats gave Ross a 3-0 record in the four-team dual-meet tournament at Findlay High School.

Ross, bowing out of the BCC at the end of this school year, claimed the title for the third time in the four-year existence of the conference.


Second in the standings went to Newark with a 2-1 mark with Lancaster next at 1-2. Findlay finished 0-3. The individual champs and runners-up were also determined by their records.

Ross had five champions and a trio of runners-up. David Boda (103), David Alejandro (112), Mat Kanan (119), Andy Reardon (160) and Chad Green (275) were the Ross champions with Boda and Green winning their second BCC titles. Jaime Hernandez (125), Lamar Shepard (145) and Brian Moreno (189) were second.

Ross coach Al Voggenthaler, in his final year of teaching and coaching at Ross, and Bill Biggers of Newark shared coach of the year honors. Findlay's Thi Tran, 140, was named the tour-

never standing wrestler in a

match," he coaches.

to the final match, Ross

defeated Findlay 48-12 and Lan-

caster 42-18.

First, Shepard and then Rear-

don came to the Little Giants

rescue against Newark.

"Those two kids and Mat

Kanan really came through,"

Voggenthaler said. "These are

kids who had struggled all

year."

After Ross rolled to a 16-2 lead

in the first four matches, New-

ark closed to 16-15 in the next

three matches.

Newark had picked up its two

points when Kanan came from

behind to draw 10-10 with Joey

Joyner. The Ross sophomore's

aggressive attack had been re-

warded when Joyner was penal-

ized two points for stalling when

he backed away from Kanan

with three seconds remaining in

the match.

With Newark closing in, Shep-

ard stopped the run, dominating

Gary Bruwell in the 145-pound

match before winning a 15-0

technical fall at the end of the

second period. That put Ross up

21-15.

"Lamar wrestled the best

match of his entire career," Vogg-

enthaler said. "That was exac-

tly when we needed it."

Newark cut the Ross lead to

21-19 as Rick DeVoll outpointed

John Hannay 17-9 in the 152-pound

match.

Up stepped Reardon. The

Little Giant quickly fell behind

Josh Milton in the 160-pound

match but early in the second

period, Reardon reversed Milton,

and pinned him in 2:46, putting

Ross up 27-19. The win was unex-

pected in the Ross camp.

"Everything Reardon does, is

unexpected," Voggenthaler said

with a laugh, "but he drilled that

kid."

Newark bounced back as Just-

in Schofield scored on a rever-

sal late in the 171-pound match

to nip Fred Schnee of Ross 8-7,

cutting the Ross lead to 27-22

with two matches remaining.

"We knew we had to win one

of those last two matches," Vogg-

enthaler said about the 189 and

275 matches.

"I couldn't relax because it

was close down there with

Greene."

Both matches were on the

mats at the same time and for

awhile, it appeared that heavy-

weight Chad Green would have

the most trouble when the match

was scoreless after two periods.

Moreno, the defending cham-

pion, had fallen behind on the

initial takedown, but had carved

out a 13-6 lead. The Ross senior

had Tim Anderson on his back

for an apparent fall when disas-

ter struck.

"He had the kid decked, just

flat-decked," Voggenthaler de-

scribed. "The referee raised his

hand once but then he (Moreno)

relaxed and the kid was tough

enough to just take him over."

Anderson got the pin in 5:22

but it became academic when

Green escaped from Slaughter at

the outset of the final period and

picked up two penalty points for

stalling to post a 3-0 win.
