Aqua Giants have 14 veterans

Fourteen lettermen will bolster the Ross High School swimming team as the season begins Tuesday in the Fremont Junior High School natatorium.

"Depth-wise," Coach Art Bucci said, "this is probably the best that we have had."

Bucci is in his eighth year as the Aqua Giants coach. In seven of those years, Ross swimmers have been in the state meet.

Chris Black and Steve Rodd, two of the swimmers who represented Ross in the state meet on the free style relay return. Black is a junior who Bucci says is the most versatile swimmer that he has coached at Ross. Rodd is a senior.

Ross had an 8-3 dual record a season ago to go with fifth place finishes in the Upper Arlington and Perry Relays and a seventh in the district meet.

"We have a lot of versatile kids," Bucci said, "with several kids able to swim anything. We have a lot of kids like that and that's nice."

"We are going to be strong in the freestyle events with Black, Rodd and Ty Heslet," Bucci predicted, "and we will be very decent in the butterfly, breaststroke and diving."

Bucci has senior Tad Winning and junior Mark Lowther, both lettermen, as the main "fly" men while seniors Brian Wensinger and Randy Randolph along with sophomore Dean Beck are the breaststrokers.

In diving, Bucci has three lettermen, seniors Dan Ackerman and John Albrechta and junior Troy Overmyer back.

"We had some super times in the district meet

last year," Bucci said, "and we have a goal to finish in the top three at the district this season."

Bucci will handle the swimmers while Bob Lozano, a volunteer coach, is the diving instructor.

Running down through the remaining lettermen, Bucci clicked off what the veterans would be swimming:

— Jim Ferguson, senior, backstroke, breaststroke, freestyle and the individual medley.

— David Hetrick, senior, freestyle distance events.


Bucci also has a strong complement of girls in his 23 swimmers.

"Jill Isaac and Amy Koenig are both two-event district qualifiers," he pointed out, "and Heather Winning can swim anything. Plus, we have Lori Smith and Kelly Sabiers who are looking good."

Isaac and Koenig are letter winners from last season while the other three are highly touted sophomores.

Ross will host Margaretta on "parent's Night" Tuesday. On the weekend, the Aqua Giants will travel to Upper Arlington for a Friday night dual meet and the Upper Arlington Invitational on Saturday.

Several home meets have been designated with special name tags: Dec. 18, against Lima is Alumni Day (1 p.m.), Jan. 4, against Sandusky is Swimmer-Friend Meet, Jan. 8, against Napoleon is Faculty-Student Day (1 p.m.), Jan. 18, versus Perkins is Dignitary Night, and Feb. 8, against Sylvania Northview is Senior Night Dinner.

Aqua Giants sink Margaretta 84-41

Fremont Ross won nine of 11 events, finishing one-two in six of them, to swamp Margaretta 84-41 in a high school swim meet at the Fremont Junior High School natatorium.

"That's the first time in seven years that we have opened the season with a win," Ross Coach Art Bucci said and then tempered that with, "usually we open up with Upper Arlington."

Upper Arlington is one of the premier high school swim teams in Ohio. Tuesday Ross simply outswam Margaretta. The Aqua Giant veterans got good support from their younger teammates in posting the easy win.

Junior lettermen Mark Lowther and Chris Black won two individual events and swam on winning relay team to pace Bucci's bunch.

Black was nine-tenths of a second off the Ross pool record with a 1:49.38 winning time in the 200-yard freestyle. He came back to win the 100-yard freestyle sprint in 50.08 seconds.

Lowther swam to a 2:18.0 clocking for the top spot in the 200-yard individual medley and racked up his second win by butterfly, clocking in with a 58.57.

Black swam the leadoff leg in Ross's winning freestyle relay while Lowther was on the Aqua Giants'

winning medley relay.

Other individual firsts for Ross went to Steve Rodd in the 50 free (23.96), Dan Ackerman in diving (155.15 points), and Brian Wensinger in the breaststroke (1:11.08).

"I got to look at some of the things we will be going with this year," Bucci said about his opening lineup. "Some of our times were very good this early in the season."

The Ross coach was pleasantly surprised with the time turned in by sophomore Heather Winning. She was second in the individual medley in 2:28.9. Kelli Sager's 1:13.53 in the backstroke was nearly four seconds better than her previous best in that event.

The Aqua Giants' one-two finishes were in the IM, 50 and 100 freestyle sprints, diving, butterfly and breaststroke.

Troy Heslet was second in the 50 with Troy Overmyer taking second in diving. Tad Winning was second in the 100 free. Randy Randolph was second in the backstroke.

Margaretta's firsts were by Tom Leber in the 50-yard freestyle (55.10) and Bill Green in the backstroke (1:01.6).

Ross will travel to Upper Arlington Friday to compete in a dual meet and the Upper Arlington Invitational Saturday.

Buckeye victory not exactly what Eldon Miller wanted

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) — Eldon Miller, Ohio State's basketball coach, admits a 78-58 romp over Cal State-Chico Tuesday night wasn't much of a learning experience.

"We need more games in difficult places," Miller said after the Buckeyes' opener against a Division II opponent. "We will know a lot more when December ends."

"The weaker thing we had tonight, without a question, was our rebounding," said Miller, aware the shorter, slower Wildcats had matched

the Buckeyes on the boards 31-31.

But Ohio State, with four regulars back from last year's 21-10 squad, outshot Cal State-Chico 50-42 percent from the field and forced the Wildcats into 25 turnovers.

"Our defense was very sporadic," Miller said. "We did not do a good job in the transition game."

Tony Campbell's 18 points led a balanced Ohio State attack. Troy Taylor added 16 and Granville Waiters and Larry Huggins had 11 each. All were regulars a year ago.

Union, owners still at odds over final words

WASHINGTON (AP) — Three days before National Football League players vote on the five-year, \$1.6-billion collective bargaining agreement that ended their 57-day strike, negotiators for the league and the players' union remain at odds over the document's final language.

"Five or six issues still have to be resolved," union spokesman Frank Woschitz said Tuesday night.

Meanwhile, the failure of negotiators to reach a final accord has forced a delay in a vote on the pact by player representatives.

The player reps, who had hoped to vote Tuesday, are now expected to vote late today on whether or not to recommend ratification to the full membership.

That is not binding on the full membership, which votes Friday.

Union sources say two major areas of contention in the still-uncompleted agreement are the union's insistence that the league guarantee that players will be paid extra if it expands its regular season and that management drop its demand to extend the college draft in its current form through 1992.

Union officials have accused the league of attempting to write language into the final draft to leave open expansion of the regular season in 1983 and beyond. Management

negotiators say the league has no immediate plans to either add teams or expand the season.

On the latter question, union officials say they fear an antitrust suit by the new United States Football League against the NFL and the players' union citing both parties for restraint of trade in extending the college draft past expiration of the collective bargaining agreement in 1982. While the NFL is capable of waging a long, costly court fight, union officials say the players' association does not have the finances for such a battle.

Jack Donlan, the NFL's chief negotiator, and attorneys Sargent Karch and Steve Curran, met with union officials late Monday night and again Tuesday in hopes of ironing out the dispute. Further talks have been delayed as NFL officials travel to Pittsburgh today to attend the funeral of Kathleen Rooney. Mrs. Rooney, the wife of Pittsburgh Steeler owner Art Rooney, died Sunday.

Last week, union chief Ed Garvey said he expected the players to reject the tentative agreement but to continue to play as negotiations continued.

Donlan has insisted the Nov. 16 agreement is total and complete and that no further changes will be made.

Upper Arlington swimmers top Aqua Giants

UPPER ARLINGTON — Chris Black and Randy Randolph were the only Ross winners during an 84-43 loss to Upper Arlington in a high school swim meet Friday.

Black needed five minutes flat to win the 500-yard freestyle and Randolph led a one-two Ross sweep in the breaststroke. Randolph recorded a 1:11.10 to finish ahead of Brian Wensinger's 1:12.20.

Black also had a third in the 200 free in 1:50.2.

Mark Lowther had seconds in the individual medley and the butterfly. He finished the former in 2:15.5 and the latter in 58.20.

Steve Rodd was second in the 50 free for the Aqua Giants, finishing in 23.6 seconds. He was also third in the 100 free in 53.70.

Heather Winning took third in the backstroke in 1:07.8. Ross teammate Jim Ferguson was fourth in 1:07.9.

In the relays, Ross's medley of Lowther, Randolph, Tad Winning and Ty Heslet had a 1:50.7 to finish third and the free relay of Black, Jill Isaac, Kelly Sabiers and Rodd was second in 3:52.0.

In diving, Dan Ackerman took third with 150.15 points and Troy Overmyer was fourth with 130.18.

Ross will be competing today in the Upper Arlington Invitational.

Ross swimmers finish 6th in Upper Arlington Relays

UPPER ARLINGTON — The Ross swim team, paced by a second-place finish by the 200-yard freestyle relay team, came in sixth place in the prestigious nine-team Upper Arlington Relays here Saturday.

Worthington won the event with 146 points, followed by Upper Arlington (134), Gates Mills Hawken (112), Columbus Academy (92), Birmingham (Mich.) Brother Rice (88), Ross (80), Cincinnati Princeton (40),

Cleveland St. Ignatius (38) and Marietta (24).

"It was a good meet for us," said Ross Coach Art Bucci. "With a few more points, we could have finished third or fourth. That's not too bad against teams like these. But we still have a lot of work to do."

The 200-yard freestyle relay team of Steve Rodd, Ty Heslet, Tad Winning and Chris Black swam a 1:35.22 to finish second by just .02 of a second.



Black's record paces swimmers

Chris Black's pool record in the individual medley anchored the Ross High School swim team to a 74-46 win over Wauseon Tuesday at the Fremont Junior High School natatorium.

Black, a junior, carved over a second from the two minutes, six and one-half seconds prior record set by Jim Burns of Sylvania Southview last season. The Aqua Giant covered the 200 yards in 2:05.37.

The new record is .27 of a second off the school mark held by Randy Penrod.

The Aqua Giants racked up eight first places. There were seven different individual winners to go along with a first in the medley relay.

Black, Randy Randolph, Mark Lowther and Tad Winning posted a 1:49.6 to take the relay. Lowther won the butterfly and Randolph captured the breaststroke.

Steve Rodd won the 200 freestyle with Tad Winning and Ty Heslet taking the 50 and 100 yard sprints, respectively. Dan Ackerman was the diving winner for Ross.

Ross had "1-2" finishes in the 100 free, breaststroke and diving.

Heather Winning, a sophomore, took second in the 500 free with a clocking of 5:38.6.

"That was her best time in that event," Ross Coach Art Bucci said.

Troy Overmyer was second in diving with other Ross runnerup finishes going to Jim Ferguson in the 100 free, Brian Wensinger in the breaststroke and the freestyle relay team of Jill Isaac, Tracey Turner, and Black and Ferguson.

Swimmers sink Lima 91-31

Ross celebrated its first "Alumni Day" Saturday by winning all 11 events while swamping outmanned Lima Senior 91-31 in a high school swim meet at the Fremont Junior High School natatorium.

The special day, which drew approximately 30 former Ross Swimmers, was no contest as the Aqua Giants swept the top two spots in seven events.

Chris Black won two events and the Aqua Giants swept to one-two finishes in both the medley and freestyle relays. Black took the 200-yard individual medley by lapping his two competitors. The Ross junior finished in 2:06.4, a full 40 seconds ahead of runnerup teammate Amy Koenig.

Black came back to take the top spot in the butterfly with a 57.85 seconds clocking.

Troy Overmeyer was a convincing winner in the diving portion of the meet for Ross, piling up 172.6 points to finish ahead of teammate Jon Albrechta.

Heather Winning was a clear winner in the 500-yard freestyle for Ross, clocking off a 5:42.86 winning time.

Ross lucks out

PORT CLINTON — "We were lucky to get out of there with a victory," said Ross swimming coach Art Bucci.

Bucci was referring to his squad's narrow 64-63 dual meet triumph over the Port Clinton Redskins here Tuesday night.

"The kids just didn't seem mentally prepared," said Bucci. "We should have won eight events, instead we only won four." Actually, it was five.

Winners for the Aqua Giants were Chris Black, Mark Lowther, Steve Rodd, Dan Ackerman and the 400 freestyle relay team.

Bucci switched Black from the 500 freestyle to the 100 freestyle, moving Rodd from the 100 free to the 500 free in the process. The move worked.

Black won the 100 free in the near-record time of 49.91 seconds. His mark was .01 of a second off the PC pool standard.

And Rodd swam a 5:29.18 to finish first in the 500 free.

Meanwhile, Lowther won the 100 butterfly in 59.31 and the 400 free relay team of Black, Ty Heslet, Tad Winning and Rodd won its event in 3:35.18.

Ross had a 1-2-3 sweep in the diving competition, led by Ackerman's 157.15 points. Troy Overmyer was next with 151.25 points, followed by John Albrechta's district-qualifying 140.05 points.

Other highlights for the Aqua Giants last night came from:

— Heather Winning with a personal-best of 2:25.97 in the 200 individual medley;

— Tad Winning with a personal-best 1:02.00 in the 100 butterfly;

Aqua Giants' party sour for Sandusky

Art Bucci had a surprise party thrown for him and it wasn't his birthday.

Instead, Bucci's Ross High School swim team turned in enough surprise performances to give the coach a 66-61 win over the previously unbeaten Blue Streaks at the Fremont Junior High School natatorium Tuesday.

The Aqua Giants, 5-1 this season, won seven events, two apiece by Chris Black and Steve Rodd, but it was a third place finish in the opening event that started the party for Bucci.

"That third place finish in the medley relay gave us a big boost," Bucci said. "I had not expected to take anything except first in that."

Ross did get the expected first from the quartet of Jim Ferguson, Randy Randolph, Mark Lowther and Ty Heslet with a clocking of 1:52.37 but the team of Lori Smith, Brian Wensinger, Heather Winning and Amy Koenig shocked Sandusky. The latter team touched out the Blue Streaks by an eye lash for third.

The margin of victory was so slight that both teams clocked in at two minutes, three and four-tenths seconds.

"That was nice," the Ross coach smiled, "but Rodd's wins in the 50 and 100 freestyles were big turning points for us."

Rodd took the 50 in 23.75 seconds and came back to complete the sprint double with a 51.68 in the 100.

Those wins followed on the heels of a clash between Ross's top swimmer and Sandusky's. Chris Black of the Little Giants was a shade off the pool record (1:48.5) with a 1:48.91 to easily defeat Jim Stauffer of the Blue Streaks in the 200 freestyle.

Black followed up with a victory in the 500 freestyle and turned in a 48.7 seconds split in anchoring the Ross freestyle relay team.

The freestyle team came in second, losing by a tenth of a second, 3:32.5 to 3:32.6 despite Black's last leg heroics. Black made up nearly a two-length deficit when he took over his leg. Again, Stauffer was Black's opponent on the leg but the Sandusky swimmer had just enough to shade the Ross junior.

The Little Giants began to take away any doubt of the outcome with a one-three finish in the diving competition. Dan Ackerman's 168.35 topped the close competition. Jeff Pean finished second for Sandusky, nearly three points behind Ackerman. Troy Overmyer turned in his top diving performance of the season for Ross, taking third with 161.07.

Mark Lowther won the butterfly in 57.7 for the Aqua Giants over first place. That finish went along with his second in the medley. Randolph had a second in the breaststroke to round out the first and second place finishes for Ross.

"If there ever was a team victory, this was it," Bucci explained. "Sandusky had their swimmers in the events I expected and everyone else for us swam like we planned."

Bucci's plans worked out and a pair of Ross swimmers made the party happier with their quickest times of the season. Lowther had his top time in the butterfly and Randolph's 1:09.63 in the breaststroke was a two-second drop.

Saturday, the Aqua Giants will host Napoleon in the "Student/Faculty Day" meet. Swimming begins at 1 p.m.


