Coach Harold Schahet's Ross high cross country team won its second meet in a row Tuesday at Toledo, whipping Whitmer 19 to 36 at Ottawa Park.

Fremont won four of the first five places: 1. Duane Hack 2. Marvin Hines 3. Gene Albert 4. Dick Kwinup. Winning time (two miles) 11:07.

Coach Harold Schahet's Ross high cross country team remained undefeated for the season with a 27 to 28 verdict over Ashland at Ashland Thursday.

Duane Hack of Ross finished first in the time of 10 minutes, 46 seconds for the two-mile course. Other Ross places: Marvin Hines, third; Gene Albert, fourth; Rein Walter, ninth; Charles Johnson, tenth.

Next meet for the Ross harriers will be against Sandusky high at Rodger Young Park next Tuesday. The Little Giants own a 3-0 record.
