Outlook: Inexperience prevented Ross from making a serious run at GLL champion Whitmer, and Bedford, which has won the league 26 of the last 28 years. Last year, that was an excuse. This year, Dowell hopes to put into action what his team has learned. Derek Wensinger shined at 103 as a freshman last year, winning the GLL. The team will look forward to winning its own Mal Mackey Tournament for the third time Jan. 4.

Clay outwrestles Ross at Purple Pit

Hard to tell what the most defining moment of the Fremont Ross wrestling team's opening loss to Oregon Clay Wednesday night was.

Was it Eric Lindsey punching the bleachers in disgust after his 215-pound loss?

Was it a rubber-legged Ty Stout writhing in pain after having his neck pretzel in the heavyweight bout?

Or was it the perturbed expression emanating from coach Grover Dowell's face as the Eagles took a 48-18 triumph at the Purple Pit.

Save for pins by Ross's Derek Wensinger (119 pounds), Cody

Franks (130) and Tyler Lawrence (145), Clay outmaneuvered, outsmarted and ultimately outwrestled the Little Giants en route to its first dual-meet win over Ross in five years.

"I was disgusted once we started getting toward the older kids," said Dowell, who, if he had his way, said he would have put his team through a practice right after the match. "The more experienced kids were really disappointing, while the younger kids did a nice job fighting."

Dowell admitted he was out-coached, too.

"I have to accept this defeat," he said, "because I obviously did not have the kids mentally prepared. Physically, they have it."

Coming off a 5-5 season, Ross spotted Clay a 12-0 edge on a forfeit in the 103 class and the Eagles' Zach Martin's pin 1:34 into his 112 match with Greg Willoughby.

Clay's most convincing victory came at 125, where Curtis Freeman needed only 12 seconds to dispose of A.J. Durbin.

Clay senior Steve Delapena took a 5-3 decision over Josh Cherry in 135, while freshman Ryan Donley took down senior Mike Willer at the final buzzer

for a 19-18 decision in 160.

"Steve Delapena was a little bit over weight today, but he's a GLL finalist and he did a heck of a job for us. I was pleased that he gutted it out and he showed a lot of guts because he was hurting a little bit," said Clay coach Rex Ruby.

Down 36-18, the Little Giants need pins in the last four matches to salvage a tie.

They didn't get it.

At 215, Lindsey was by far the aggressor, but second-year grappler Kevin Heinsall recovered from a takedown to pin Lindsey.

Spotting Stout 63 pounds, Clay heavyweight Bill Dart — despite

a lost contact lens — mauled Stout, mostly by crushing him onto his own neck. 29 seconds into the third period.

Stout regained his feet — but not his bearings — and continued the bout.

"(Stout) got manhandled by a kid that's 50 pounds lighter than him and that's going to happen at any weight class if you don't hit the moves," said Dowell. "I don't know if we're not in shape, but there's a lot more drilling to come."

"I've never had that poor of a team display as far as team goes and I hate to put a whole team down because a lot of kids worked their tails off but that's discouraging, depressing, disappointing."

Confidence will often take a wrestler farther than strength, and Wednesday night, Fremont Ross competed with the confidence they needed to win its first dual meet of the season, 48-30, at Fostoria.

"The kids did a lot better (than their season-opening loss to Oregon Clay)," Little Giants coach Grover Dowell said. "Things are coming along a lot better. They moved better and wrestled with more confidence.

"Still, there's some things we have to drill and work on, but they did a nice job. I was really pleased, all the way through the lineup."

Earning pins for the Little Giants were Josh Cherry at 135 pounds, Don Wensigner (152), Mitch Holland (160), Jesse Sandoval (171) and Keith Mosser (189).

Holland was filling in for Mike Willer, who is out indefinitely with a shoulder injury. Ross was also minus heavyweight Ty Stout, still ailing from a neck injury sustained against Clay.

Derek Wensigner earned a technical fall over Randall Bradner at 119, Cody Franks took a 12-7 decision against Brandon Distel at 130 and Eric Lindsey triumphed as Chris Hall defaulted with knee injury at 215.

Dowell attributed the victory to a week's worth of "a lot of drilling and a lot of lecturing," sandwiched around last Saturday's fifth-place finish at the Ashland Invitational.

"I was really pleased with the desire of the kids," Dowell said. "They showed they did have some heart and want to win. That's what it's about. Wrestling's 85 percent mental, and they have to be able to go."

The Little Giants are in the two-day Rogers Invitational this weekend.


Clyde has the beef at Wendy's Invitational

Ross wrestlers outscore Lima Shawnee for title

Above an exit sign near the stage inside the Fremont Ross High School gymnasium is a sign that reads: "Put Them Flat on The Mat!"

The banner proved to be prophetic as the Ross Little Giants captured their fourth straight team title Saturday at the 24th Annual Mal Mackey Memorial Wrestling Tournament.

Ross amassed 146 points, 10 more than runner-up Lima Shawnee. Toledo Central Catholic placed third with 121.5 points, and Spencerville edge Euclid 110 to 108.5 for fourth place in the eight-team tournament.

Ross placed eight wrestlers in the final round, with two being crowned champions and six as runners-up.

Fremont coach Grover Dowell was also named the tournament's outstanding coach.

Tyler Lawrence pinned Dan-

ny Painter of Lima Shawnee in 4 minutes, 16 seconds to capture the 140-pound championship, and Don Wensinger recorded a majority decision, 15-5, over Northwood's Dave Wauford to win the 145-pound title match.

"I am really surprised the kids wrestled that well in the semi-finals. They really did an outstanding job," Dowell said. "I thought we could be in the running (for the team title). We had six (wrestlers) seeded and placed eighth in the final round."

Placing as runners-up for the Little Giants were Derek Wensinger at 112, Cody Franks

at 125, Jesse Sandoval at 170, Keith Mossler at 189, Aaron Root at 215 and Ty Stout at 275.

"I have to look at (our tournament success) that is a young team," Dowell said. "We made some mental mistakes, but (overall) our underclassmen did an outstanding job."

Sophomore Steve Simok of Northwood was named the tournament's most valuable wrestler.

Simok, who is undefeated this season at 16-0, placed second in last year's tournament and also competed in the state tournament as a freshman.

"I was surprised. This is my first award this year," Simok said. "From here I will just take it one tournament at a time and hopefully get back to state."

Spencerville's Ryan Roby, who placed third in the 215-pound weight class, received the award for most pins in the least amount of time. Roby recorded three pins in 8:21.

Stout wins final match to force tie with Findlay

There's no situation more invigorating to a heavyweight wrestler than knowing he's about to enter a meet-clinching match.

It's pitcher vs. hitter with the bases loaded in the bottom of the ninth. Goalie vs. skater in hockey's sudden-death shootout. Offense vs. defense in the fifth quarter of a football game. Anyone vs. the dollar slot of a Coca-Cola machine.

For the last two years, betting men haven't exactly been wagering on Fremont Ross's Ty Stout in must-win matches.

But all bets were off Thursday night, as Stout beat Findlay's Brian Householder, 4-3, to help Ross rally from a 30-6 deficit to a 36-36 Great Lakes League tie at the Purple Pit.

Like kissing your sister? Maybe.


A moral victory? Without doubt.

"It's kind of nice because this is the first match in the clincher I've actually won," said Stout, who has been handicapped by a neck injury suffered in the season's first match. "Sophomore and junior years I've always lost in the clinchers and this year I pulled it out and I wrestled a lot better against him than I have against the other heavyweights of the GLL."

Ross (2-2-1) won seven of the last eight matches — only two by pins — to tie the Trojans (0-3-1) for the second straight season.

With Findlay leading 12-6 after the forfeits in the first three matches, the Trojans received three straight pins as Ross struggled to simply generate any intensity.

The Trojans' Josh Smith downed Brian Holland in 1:07 at 125 pounds, 130-pounder Bo Bennett dumped Cody Franks with 17 seconds left in the second period and Levi Shadle pinned Josh Cherry in 3:09 at

135 to make it 30-6.

"I was a little disappointed in my older kids and more experienced kids that I was almost certain would win, but that's the way it goes," said Ross coach Grover Dowell, who has never lost to Findlay.

He added, "When we were down 30-6, I was a little scared. I didn't think we'd pull it through."

But Tyler Lawrence got the

ball rolling for the Little Giants with an 11-5 win over Josh Palmer at 140 before Don Wensinger breathed more life into the home crowd with a 3-minute, 15-second pin of Jeremy Reznik at 145.

The meet's first turning point came when Ross 152-pounder Mike Willer withstood a kick as well as a lost contact lens and defeated Joe Orozco, 13-10, to make it 30-18.

"(Willer) has an awful lot of experience on the mat and he pulled it through (Thursday) night and that really helped us," said Dowell.

Findlay's Matt Gibson scored the last six points against Jesse Sandoval at 160, but Sandoval hung on for a 13-12 win.

Schneider at 171. But Ross's experience at 189 (senior Keith Mosser) and 215 (junior Aaron Root) provided a pair of pins in a combined time of 2 minutes, 11 seconds.

"Fremont has a veteran squad and I figured we'd lose at 189 and 215," said Findlay coach Sam Bello, whose team has lost to Bedford, Whitmer and Clay. "We had a surprise at 171, I wasn't expecting that pin. After that I figured we'd lose the next two for sure, and heavyweight was a question mark."

Stout provided Bello with an answer — but not very quickly.

The heavyweight bout was tackle (Stout) vs. 6-foot-6 tight end (Householder), and it was a stalemate for 2:43 before Householder gained an escape point. Stout earned a takedown on his at the second-period buzzer.

Householder had the only takedown of the third, but Stout had two

escapes, the second with 56 seconds left. In danger of stalling and with Householder poised to make his move, Stout emerged victorious as time elapsed.

"I got fatigued towards the end of the second period because I haven't been running lately because of a knee problem. I ran out of gas," said Stout, now 6-12.
