Cannon Repeats, Syracuse Places Pair On AP Stars

NEW YORK (AP)—Billy Cannon, Louisiana State's explosive halfback, is a repeater and unbeaten Syracuse is the only team with two representatives on The Associated Press 1959 All America football team.

The team, representing every section of the country, is announced today after thorough sifting of the recommendations of 12 regional boards of newsmen.

Cannon, winner of the Heisman Trophy and top pick of the pros, heads a backfield unit which includes his Sugar Bowl opponent, Charley Flowers of Mississippi; versatile Jim Motty of Arkansas

and Bob Schloredt, the one-eyed quarterback who guided Washington into the Rose Bowl.

Syracuse, the nation's No. 1 team, provided a pair of the huskies for the 1½ ton line—Fred Mautino, 191½ pound, pass-snagging end, and Roger Davis, 228-pound guard whose alert linebacking featured the Orangemen's rugged defense.

Opposite Mautino at end is Marvin McKeever, one of the ferocious twins from Southern California, and the other guard is Bill Burrell of Illinois, a former fullback. The tackles are Don Floyd of Texas Christian and Dan Lanphear of Wisconsin. The center is Georgia Tech's Maxie Baughan.

Cannon, 23 and father of three, has been the chief offensive weapon of an LSU team which has lost only one game in two years. Shotputter, weightlifter and a 9.5 second sprinter, he was the team's "climax" man — always coming through in the big moments.

Ross Grapplers Lose To Redmen

Ross high fell out of the unbeaten ranks in wrestling Thursday, losing to Fostoria 23-20 before a large school audience in the Ross gym.

Ross school children were given the option of going to a study hall or paying a small price to view the wrestling match (which started at 2:15 p.m.). Most of the students attended the match.

Educational aspects of viewing good wrestling and not the type seen on television screens today makes the program practical.

Coach Joe Kinshaw's Fostoria grapplers won for the fourth time in 10 matches with Fremont Ross although Coach Mal Mackey's matmen won more individual events, six to five. But Fostoria won four of its five by pins while Ross could gain only one pin.

Crowd of more than 300 watched Fremont Ross and Toledo Central Catholic battle to a 21-21 wrestling deadlock in the Ross Senior high gym Friday.

Coach Mal Mackey's matmen were effective in the lesser weights as in past matches but didn't have enough strength in the bigger weights.

Tim Shanahan, 112-pound division, a junior, remained unbeaten for the season with a 2-1 decision over Jim Grabowski. T. Shanahan has a 4-0-1 record (four wins, no losses, one draw).

Other Ross victories were scored by Jim Mooney, George Shanahan, Reuben Rendon and Dean Dorr. Dave Heppner of Ross, in the 165-pound weight, wrestled to a 5-5 draw against Don Naugle.
