

Ross' Kelly, Haas; Clyde's Slessman In Mat Tourney

Two youths from Fremont Ross and one grappler from Clyde will represent the area this weekend in the Ohio high school wrestling tournament at St. John's arena in Columbus.

Ross' Larry Kelly and Glen Haas and Clyde's Frank Slessman will weigh in Friday at 9 a.m. and will be in action sometime that afternoon . . . Draws won't be made until Friday.

Kelly, 127 - pounder, Haas, 138-pounds, and Slessman, 175-pounds, all were champions in their respective divisions in the district wrestling tournament held two weeks ago here.

In order to become state champion, a boy must win four matches in Columbus.

Both Kelly and Haas have missed several practice sessions

since the district as both have been feeling ill. Kelly was unable to drill at all last week, being slowed by the flu. Coach Mal Mackey, who along with Pete Michaels will escort the Fremonters down to Columbus, said his boys are just now getting back into the groove after the layoff.

Ross' Larry Kelly, vying in the 127-pound class, was pinned by Roger Anderson of Eastlake North in 1:15 of the second round. Kelly injured his shoulder in the match and will not be able to participate in today's consolation battles.

Glen Haas of Fremont was stopped in the 138-pound class by Dan Ternes of Elyria. Ternes de-

cisioned Haas by a 7-2 score. Haas has lost only two dual matches all season and both were dealt out by the Elyrian.

Frank Slessman of Clyde failed in his bid for a state title by losing to Ron Houska of Parma via a pin in 1:52 of the third round. Slessman will participate today in consolation matches.

Doug Wentz and Tom Meyers, 103 and 165-pounds respectively from Huron, remain the only two boys from this district with a chance at state laurels.
