Marion Tops In Buckeye Track Meet

Sandusky First In
Golf; Ross Last In
Track, Fifth In Golf

FINDLAY — Marion swept to victory in track and Sandusky in golf while the tennis matches and baseball game were rained out here yesterday in Buckeye Conference Sports Day at Donnell Stadium.

The Marion thinlies rolled up 103 points in winning the conference track meet, above their winning total of 86 last year. Second in track was Sandusky 45½; third, Lorain 40; fourth, Findlay 16; fifth, Elyria 14; and sixth, Fremont 5½.

Only track point-getters for Ross high were Bob Mesler, tied for third in the high jump; Larry Chapin, tied for fifth in the pole vault; and the mile relay team of Mesler, Ron Shawl, Mike Cochran and Gene Albert, fourth in that event. Chapin cleared 9 feet in the vault and Mesler 5 feet, 2 inches in the high jump.

Mesler won the third place medal in the high jump when he out-tossed the other two third place winners. The other Ross winners and Mesler received ribbons.

Marion won 10 firsts of 14 in track including double victories by Bruce Roberts in the high and low hurdles, Dick Pickens in the 100 and 220-yard dashes and Bill Hull in the mile and 880-yard runs.
