# Ross Baseballers To Go With New Coach, Rookies

Ross enters the 1962 baseball campaign with a new coach and only two regulars off last season's squad.

Don Purvis, a graduate of Bowling Green State university and former New York Yankee farmhand, is in his first season as head of the Giants' diamond activity. Purvis has only senior Chuck Hufford and junior Terry Stout back from last year's outfit that was hit hard by rainouts.

Hufford will man the hot corner and Stout is set at shortstop.

From that point on, Purvis informs, everything is up for grabs and positions likely will be handled by underclassmen.

Assisting Purvis this season is Hank Miesle, who played baseball for St. Joe and later for Fremont in the Ohio State league.

Rounding out the infield, Purvis names sophomores Dave George, Jerry Bender and John Whitaker as likely candidates for second base. However, Purvis is quick to point out that it is a bit early yet to make definite decisions as Ross has been working out only this week. Presently, there are 47 boys seeking berths and Purvis will cut his final squad down to around 20.

Bill Stull, a big, strong senior, and Alex Hyzer, a junior, will compete for the first base spot. Hyzer also is listed as a pitcher.

John Prosser, a junior, and Larry Ross, senior, are battling for the catcher's position. Purvis said there is a large turnout fighting for the three outfield berths and two who have looked good to date are Bob Sanford, junior, and Wayne Huffman, senior.

Along with Hyzer on the mound will be Bob Hite, sophomore; Jerry Brudzinski, junior; Mark Jaderstrom, senior; Dave Fleming, senior; and Mike Frantz, sophomore.

Overall, Purvis feels he may need more pitching strength but it appears he has a couple of power hitters in Prosser and Sanford. The infield seems fair but the outfield still is a question mark. The club's defensive status depends a great deal on sophomore potential, Purvis explained.

Ross opens its season April 9 with a home game against Huron. Purvis hopes to play 10 games in addition to tournament action.

Ross high's baseball team jumped off to a 4-1 lead then chocked off a late Gibsonburg rally to win its first game of the season Tuesday afternoon on the Bears' diamond, 6-4.

John Prosser had a strong day at bat, collecting four hits in five times at bat and getting three consecutive triples. He scored three runs and drove in one.

Wayne Huffman also chipped in with a pair of hits in four trips and was a big factor in getting the Little Giants off to an early lead. Huffman, an outfielder, knocked in two runs.

Alex Hyzer started on the mound for Ross and gave up only two singles in five innings. He left with the Giants ahead 6 - 1. Mark Jaderstrom came on in the sixth when Gibsonburg rallied. The Bears touched him for two singles, a double, triple and an error to produce three runs. Jaderstrom steadied in the seventh to retire the side and end the game.

## Little Giants Edge Streaks 5 To 4 In 10 Inning See-Saw Baseball Game

Ross' Little Giants spotted St. Joe three runs in the first two innings yesterday but came back to nip their crosstown rivals 5-4 in an error-filled baseball game played at Anderson Field. The game went 10 innings.

Chuck Hufford led off the 10th and was safe on an error. After two were out Sanford grounded to shortstop who bobbled the ball and then tried to catch the runner at first. Hufford was able to score all the way on the play.

St. Joe almost won the game in

the ninth when Tom Kashmer doubled and tried to come home on an infield hit by Dan Hotz. Prosser tagged the runner sliding in but dropped the ball. The umpire ruled Prosser had held the ball long enough.

St. Joe scored three times in the first two innings on two hits, a walk and an error. Ross came back with three in the fourth on one hit, two bases on balls and three errors.

Ross took a 4-3 lead in the fifth on Prosser's single, a walk to Wayne Huffman and another pass to Stull. Kashmer came on to relieve starter Bill Dickman at this point and Dave George was safe on an error, scoring Prosser.

St. Joe tied it in the fifth when Chet Luc was safe on an error

and he came home on Russ Gabel's single.

Ross had six hits and St. Joe got 10.

Alex Hyzer went the distance for Ross, giving up five walks and fanning 11. Dickman worked four plus innings and struck out five and passed five. He yielded four hits. Kashmer fanned five and didn't walk a batter.

Ross is now 3-0 and St. Joe 2-5 on the season.
