## Ross will chase Golden Gales

The second Buckeye Central Conference Track and Field Meet promises to be a rerun.

Fremont Ross hosts the meet Saturday. Preliminaries begin at 10 a.m. and running event finals, with the exception of the 3200-meter relay, at 12:30 p.m. The 3200 relay final will be held at about 10:45 a.m.

Lancaster is the odds-on pick to win the boys crown but that's where Ross is hoping the rerun gets edited.

"Lancaster, definitely, in the boys," Ross Coach John Elder said. "The battle will be for second; I feel we can place in the top three."

Considering the BCC has only five teams, the statement sounded less than optimistic but it would be an improvement for the Little Giants — Ross was first from the bottom a year ago.

"We are going to have to do well in the sprints," Elder said.

Findlay is expected to repeat in the girls division and Elder admitted it will take a strong effort for the Little Giants to repeat its runner-up finish. The Trojans beat Ross 77-75 in 1988 but Findlay has a strong nucleus back.

"For the girls to do well," Elder said, "we have to have good performances in the distance events, the discus and long jump."

And he'll take any other points gratefully.

"This will be an exciting meet," Elder predicted, "with Lancaster having several state-caliber athletes."

One of them is 1988 state 3200-meter champ Ira Wentworth. Wentworth has run the 1600 in 4:20 and the 3200 in 9:40 this season.

Ross sprinter Troy Williamson tops the 200-meter men with a time of 22.8. Williamson also leads the 400-meter entrants with a 50.7 clocking this season. T.J. Hall of Ross is second in the 100 with an 11.12 timing.

In the girls events, Stacy Pasch and Amy Ritzman of Ross rank second and third in the 800 with clockings of 2:27.8 and 2:28.2. Ritzman is also the conference's leading long jumper with a 16-1 effort while teammate Connie McMorris ranks fourth with 15-6 effort.

# Lancaster, Findlay capture second BCC titles

Dave Agosta did not want to be accused of not trying, but rather as taking a conservative approach to coming events.

"We have won our district 28 of the last 30 years," the Lancaster boys track and field coach said, "but last year we got a scare. This year, we want to be on a high point (for the district)."

His team could not be described as being on a "low" but just "high" enough to win its second Buckeye Central Conference title in the conference's second meet. It was a repeat of last year.

Ditto in the girls meet. Findlay made it 2-for-2.

After the two champs repeated in the Saturday event at the Ross High School track, the standings were slightly jumbled from 1988. The Ross boys jumped from the basement to the bridesmaid spot, finishing with 55 points, 16 behind Lancaster. Findlay took third with 45 while Newark had 43. Zanesville was in the basement with 39.

Ross held onto its spot from

1988 in the girls meet, finishing behind the Trojans 82½ to 60. Third was Lancaster with 46½, followed by Newark at 37 and Zanesville looking up from the bottom with 26.

"We were not looking at the meet as not being competitive — it was," Agosta said, "but we had five or six kids running in different events. We wanted to guard against what happened in the districts last year."

The district meets are this week.

Lancaster won five events, setting records in two and tying a record in another.

Lancaster's Dan Crutt won the long jump with a record 22-5, four inches better than Troy Williamson of Ross.

Williamson's performances led Ross. He won two events and finished second in two others. It was a performance that Ross Coach John Elder felt should have won him the meet's outstanding performer award, but instead, it went to Ira Wentworth of Zanesville.

"He should have been," Elder
