Buckeye Conference Meet Here Saturday With Ross, Elyria, Sandusky And Findlay

Ross gym will be the site of the first annual Buckeye Conference wrestling tournament Saturday afternoon and night. Preliminaries are set for 2 p.m. with finals going off at 7:30 p.m.

John Titsworth, Ross faculty manager and director of the tourney, will hold a blind draw Thursday as pairings are being lined up. Teams from Elyria, Findlay, Sandusky and Ross will make up this year's tournament. Elyria stands as the favorite, with Sandusky second and Ross third.

Findlay only recently added wrestling.

Next season the site will be switched to another league school

at Mansfield and both Lorain teams are expected to participate. Marian, also a Buckeye Conference member, does not have wrestling. Mansfield and Admiral King will be added to next season's membership. Lorain, because of the split to two schools in that city, does not have a team this year.

Wrestlers in Saturday's tourney will eat at the school cafeteria.

Ross gym also will be the site of the big district tournament set for February 16-17. Eighteen squads are expected to be shooting for the title.

The Little Giants have not met either Elyria or Findlay this sea-

son but they have battled Sandusky twice.

Little Giants Second

Elyria Runs Off With Mat Meet

Elyria, unbeaten this season, easily walked off with the first annual Buckeye Conference wrestling tournament held at Ross gym Saturday afternoon and night.

The Pioneers, taking nine of 11 first places, finished with a total of 118 points. Ross was second with 68 points, Sandusky third with 63 points and Findlay trailed with 35 points. Sandusky holds two decisions over the Little Giants this season in dual competition.

Curt Joseph was Ross' only gold medal winner as he won a decision from John Vincent in the

103-pound class to open the finals. Sandusky's Tom Smoot was the only other first place winner other than Elyria men. He recorded one of the two pins in the final round. Smoot won his gold medal in the 175-pound class.

The only other pin was recorded by Elyria's husky Ken Lehman, a heavyweight, over Sandusky's Jim Scally.

Elyria placed a contestant in each event of the finals. Ross had six.
