Ken Pasch, Bob Hite, Rick Gabel and Dave George each had two hits for the winners. Larry Arend and Ron Kerr hit safely for St. Joe. Arend drove in two runs with a third inning double. Kerr's hit brought in the third Streak run. Gabel belted in three runs for Ross and George was credited with two RBIs.

Ross put away the game in the sixth by scoring seven runs after two were out. Ken Pasch, Verne Erchenbrecher, Gabel and George had the key hits in the frame and St. Joe committed three errors.
