Elyria wins girls title

Sandusky back on top

SANDUSKY — It was a return to a familiar spot for the Sandusky Blue Streaks track team. For the 12th time in 22 years Sandusky claimed the Buckeye Conference Track and Field Meet.

Sandusky dislodged defending champ Mansfield 137-118 2/5 in the final count. Taking third was Marion Harding with 61 2/5 with Findlay rounding out the top four with 56 2/5. Elyria, Ross, Admiral King, and Lorain made up the second division in that order.

In the girls meet, held for only the second time and the first time in conjunction with the boys meet, Elyria walked away with the title 93-81 over Marion Harding. Defending champ Admiral King was third with 58 with Findlay and Sandusky tying for fourth with 52. Ross was sixth with 41 while Lorain and Mansfield finished in seventh and eighth, respectively.

running events. Distance runner Ron Brown won the mile and two-mile runs for the Blue Streaks but Ivan Peoples of Mansfield was the meet individual star.

Peoples won the long jump, 100, and 220 dashes and anchored the Tygers' winning 880 relay team to a 1:30.3 clocking.

Del-Ray Feagin gave Mansfield two more first places — winning the high and low hurdles races.

Ross's best finishes were seconds by Jeff Brown in the 300-meter low hurdles and Troy Amor in the shot put. Brown also finished fifth in the long jump and sixth in the 100.

Joe Leite of Ross was fifth in the pole vault and Mike Cozette was fifth in the discus. Mark Boedecker was fifth in the two-mile run for the Little Giants.

Ross's mile relay team was fifth and the 880 relay team was sixth.

Doty Clark was the star of the girls portion of the meet for Ross, finishing first in the half-mile and second in the mile. She set records in both races.

In the 880, Clark ran a 2:32.2 to set a new conference mark. She broke her younger sister's (Debbie) school record in the mile with a 5:32.2.

In other Ross girls finishes, Tonja Tucker was fifth in the 100, while the 880 relay team was sixth and the mile relay team came home fifth.

In field events, Donna Hetrick of Ross took third in the shot put. Lori Lawrence and Margaret Van Guilder were third and fourth in the discus, respectively, for the Little Giants.

King tennis champ

SANDUSKY — Admiral King won the Buckeye Conference tennis championship here Saturday.

The Admirals won the first and third singles titles while rolling up 94 points, four better than runnerup Findlay. Third went to host Sandusky with 70 with Lorain finishing fourth at 64. Elyria was fifth with 58 followed by Ross, Marion Harding, and Mansfield.

Ross's best finish was a fifth place in the second doubles. Denny Mierke, a junior, and sophomore Roger Will teamed up for Ross to take that spot. The duo defeated Gary Andorka and Gracieha Buchanan of Admiral King in the consolation finals.

The Little Giants had a pair of sixths. Dave Dorsky lost to Vic Moreno of Lorain in the consolation bracket finals of the second court singles to pick up four team points for the Little Giants.

Scott Sachs and Tim Earhart took sixth in the first doubles competition. The Ross pair lost to Mike Stamps and Tom Parks of Lorain in the consolation finals.

Randy Russo and Mark Cole won the first and third singles titles for Admiral King. Jeff Oleksinski of Findlay won the second singles crown. The first doubles champs are Phil Goetz and the Steve Davies of Findlay while Lorain's Tom Hemminger and Ray Thomas claimed the second doubles title.

DALLAS — Tom Watson, twice tied by Lee Trevino, responded to the pressure with magnificent shots down the stretch and scored his third victory of the season in the \$200,000 Byron Nelson Golf Classic.

The dynamic red-haired Watson finished off the 4-under-par 66 with a fantastic chip shot on the 18th, saving par there and the \$40,000 first prize that made him the season's leading money winner and the game's 17th \$1 million winner.

Watson acquired his ninth American title — not including his two British Open triumphs — by a single stroke over the anrushing Trevino with a 79-hole total
