Ross Drops Harrier Opener

KANSAS — It took a school record to come out ahead in a near blanket finish Wednesday as Lakota opened the cross country season with a 22-33 victory over Fremont Ross. Rex Brockschmidt, a sophomore running in tennis shoes, was clocked in 10:30 for first place. Brockschmidt cut three seconds from the Lakota school record of 10:33 set by Rene Miarer in 1966.

Brockschmidt finished ahead of teammate John Gladieux in second, third place Tom Hoffman of Ross and Lakota's Ross Smith. Only nine seconds separated the top four runners over the two-mile course and only three seconds divided second through fourth.

The win evened Ross' record at one win, one loss.

First Since 1961

Ross Harriers Top Clyde

Ross Cross Country team accomplished a feat which has escaped it since 1961 Thursday night by defeating Clyde, 22-33. The Fremont school victory came on the Clyde Green Hills golf course layout.

Strong final effort brought the Ross victory. Chris Rodriguez, Clyde senior, was first into the finish chute, with a time of 10:21, but he was chased to the end by four Little Giants. With a quarter mile to go Joe Ramirez of Clyde was running second. At this point he was passed by Fremont's Chuck Cheek, who held on for second. With 15 yards remaining Little Giants Chuck Boskovitch, Tom and Mel Hoffman caught and passed Ramirez.

Victory raised the Fremont cross country record to two wins, one loss.
