Swimmers Don't Make Final Cut

COLUMBUS — None of the Fremont Ross tankers entered in this weekend's Ohio high school swimming championships advanced to the finals.

The Little Giant 200 yard medley relay team, Mike Aten and Pat Aten were entered in individual events.

Pat Aten swam the best 200 yard individual medley of his career, but it was good enough for only 16th place in the qualifying rounds. Only the swimmers with the 12 top times advanced to Saturday's finals. He finished 14th in the 100 yard breaststroke.

Mike Aten swam a 58.7 in the 100 yard butterfly, but the time put him far down the list of qualifiers. The medley relay team swam a 1:48.6.

Divers Felix Robles and Andy Christensen didn't compete Friday. Their competition began Saturday morning. After the morning rounds, the top 12 in that event advanced to the finals.

Jeff Lewis of Upper Arlington clipped a tenth of a second off his 1969 record as he won the 100-yard backstroke in 53.7 sec-

onds Friday. The record was set during the qualifying round of the Ohio High School Swimming and Diving Championships.

Lewis also won the 200-yard individual medley in 2:01.6, just two tenths of a second off the record.

A record 63 teams entered the competitions. On Friday there were 12 qualifiers in each event. The first six moved into today's

competition as finalists, while the other six were going for the consolation.

Upper Arlington set a record of 1:41.8 in the fourth heat of the 200-yard medley relay Friday.

Bob Alsfelder of Mariemont just missed a record with a 52.3 timing in the 100-yard butterfly. The record of 52.2 was set by Ross Wales in 1965.
