

Michaels holding back judgement on 'young bunch' of Ross netters

Pete Michaels has watched his Ross High School boys tennis team perform once under pressure this season but that was not enough to let him make any judgements.

"I wish I had a little more time on the courts," he said shortly after the early April wintry setting took over northwest Ohio. "I could tell more about them.

"I do have a young bunch although I do have four returning lettermen."

Matt Collins, second in the Buckeye Conference last season and holder of a 21-6 record in the 1981 season, is Michaels' leading returnee. He will be operating for the third consecutive season from the number one singles slot.

At the second court singles spot, letterman Ross Paulson

will be stroking. He lettered in the first doubles last season.

"From this point on," Michaels explained, "I have two other lettermen but they are not working into the lineup yet."

The two are Bob Ritchart, a recent returnee from Toledo, and Bob Lopez who was on the second doubles in '81. Ritchart played in the sectionals in a singles slot for Michaels last season before moving to Toledo shortly after the season ended.

The two could move into the lineup but Michaels admitted that they are having trouble cracking into the Little Giants' traveling squad.

The number three singles player is junior Brett Bunting. This is his first year out for tennis

In the first doubles, the Ross coach has teamed senior Dave

Miller and sophomore Kurt Swartzlander.

"I was using Lopez with Miller," Michaels said, "but he (Lopez) has not started to jell so I put in the sophomore."

In the second court doubles, Jon Ickes and Chris Shirvis, both sophomores, have the early season nod from the Ross coach.

Other members of the Little Giants' traveling squad include sophomores Rob Shurmer and Jay Schaff plus junior Matt Miller. Michaels does have three others on the team but the trio of Mike Franks, Chris Robinette and Joe Capucini are young and inexperienced according to the Ross coach.

The Little Giants are not scheduled to play again until traveling to Marion Harding April 20.

Collins, Ross High School's first court singles player, was seeded first in the



Marion Harding Invitational Tennis Tournament. The tournament went according to script with Collins meeting second seeded Kai Niemi of Westerville North, via Finland, in the finals.

Niemi is the second ranked junior player in Finland and up till Saturday, had not lost in the United States. Collins turned the trick, winning a first set tiebreaker 5-3 for a 7-6 set win and then outlasting the Finish player in two

more hard fought sets.

In a match that took three hours and 15 minutes to complete, Collins, after the tension filled first set, lost his concentration and a love-set to Niemi to set up the third set.

There was not a service break until Collins broke Niemi in the 10th game of the third set. That was enough to give the revived Ross senior momentum for a 6-4 win and the title.

"It was the finest that

I have seen Matt play in the three years that I have had him,'' Michaels said, "and he needed it."

Collins had forged into the finals by defeating Bob Beachler of Tiffin Clumbian 6-3, 6-1 in the quarterfinals and topping Bill Wynkoop of Findlay 7-6 (5-3 in the tie-breaker) and 6-3 in the semifinals. Then came the match with Niemi.

Ross's doubles team of John Ickes and Chris Shirvis did not see much action, losing in the first round 10-7 in a pro set to Steve Pitts and Mike Shade of River Valley.
