Marion Sweeps To Conference Track Win

Marion overpowered five Buckeye Conference track rivals Friday night to easily win the league meet at Sandusky with 80 points. Elyria was second with 48, Sandusky right behind with 46, Findlay a distant fourth with 19, Lorain fifth with 18½ and Ross sixth with 12½.

Five new records were established, two by Elyria, two by Sandusky and one by Marion. Sandusky's Stew Williams heaved the shot put 54' six inches for one mark and the Streaks' Paul Garrett ran the 440-yard dash in 50.4 for another. Trent of Marion won the 100-yard dash in record-breaking 10-flat time. Tom Wilburn of Elyria set a record in the high jump with a leap of 6' three-fourths inches. Henry Laison of Elyria set the othermark in the 880-yard run at 2:00.2.

Fremont picked up a second place finish in the mile relay when Tom Koebel, Steve Frontz, Gary Bailey and Jim Davis came home with a time of 3:35.7. Lorain's winning time in this event was 3:34.8. The Giants got a third in the 880-yard run when Ron Brown finished with a time of 2:02.7.

Putting Sizzling Pace:

Gary Player Grabs Stroke Lead In Colonial Golf

FORT WORTH, Tex., (AP)—Gary Player, who says his putting runs in streaks and right now it's sizzling, carried a one-shot lead into the third round of the \$40,000 Colonial National Invitation Golf Tournament today.

The scrappy South African, whose moods vary with his golf game, was jubilant Friday after he fired an even-par 70 to snatch the lead from Arnold Palmer.

Player had a 36-hole total of 138, a shot ahead of Palmer and Johnny Pott.

The personable Player — who dressed in black from head-to-toe because, he contends, it gives him a feeling of strength—sank an 80-

take the lead and exclaimed later:

"I had the best putting round today that I've had in a year."

It was a bad day generally for golfdom's elite as a tricky wind swept the 7,112-yard layout. None of the remaining field of 55 cracked par and only four equalled it. This contrasted sharply with Thursday's round when nine bettered par and Palmer took the lead with a 3-under- 67.
