## HI TRACKERS OFF TO MEETING

Five of Fremont high's trackmen left at 7 o'clock Saturday morning for Oberlin where they are to take part in the annual Little Big Seven league track meet. The tracksters were accompanied by Coach C. A. Taylor and Principal J. R. Clarke. The trip was made at the early hour so that the purple and white entries would arrive to participate in the qualifying events of the dashes, jumps and pole vaults. Fremont's entries are confined to these events, necessitating all the athletes participating in the qualifying events.

The finals in all events were held this afternoon at Dill field of Oberlin college. It was not known this morning whether or not the Fremont athletes would remain at Oberlin for the banquet given by the Oberlin Boosters' club and for the presentation of ribbons and medals, as well as the silver loving cup to be presented to the meet winner.

## FREMONT HIGH FINISHES SIXTH

The Fremont high school track team finished in sixth place in the annual L. B. S. league track meet held at Oberlin Saturday. The Fremont athletes made four points, three being made by Kenny Hawk, who placed in a three cornered time for second place in the pole vault. Meincer added another point by taking fifth place in the high jump. The local boys failed to place in the dashes or the broad jump. Hawk was disqualified for the high jump in the early morning trials, because of the use of a jumping form known as diving, which is prohibited.

The L. B. S. meet was won by Elyria with  $55\frac{1}{2}$  points. The much lauded Sandusky team placed second with  $48\frac{1}{2}$  points. Oberlin placed third, Lorain fourth and Norwalk fifth. Bellevue failed to place.
