In the state semifinals. Flower fell behind Padilla, losing the first set, 6-3.

"He really had to come back," Ross coach Pete Michaels said after the pair had returned from Columbus. "Padilla is very strong and he starts well. Jim started slowly as he normally does, but I felt confident that he could win.

Flower evened the score with a 6-3 win in the second set.

"I felt very confident after Jim won the second set. He just kept coming on stronger and stronger. Jim broke Padilla's service twice in the third set.'
