## LERCH SECOND AT COLUMBUS MEETING

George Lerch, Fremont high's javelin tosser, who holds the state record for the event, mark he made at Norwalk Friday by tossing the Zulus' chief weapon a distance of 177 feet, 4½ inches, drew second place at scholastic meeting in Columbus Saturday. He was second to Popeko of Garfield high, Akron, who won the event with a toss of 165 feet, 10 and a fraction inches, more than 12 feet inside the Lerch sensation of the day previous.

The record toss of Friday, graduation from school on the same eventful date, were a bit too much for big George, who did not appear to be up to his usual form, but he has collected quite a bit of fame with his spear this season and will rest up now for the finish of his scholastic career at the Lit-
