


1964 Buckeye Conference – 2nd place

members will participate and 77 boys will compete for top honors. Teams entered are Fremont, Sandusky, Lorain, Mansfield Senior, Lorain Admiral King, Findlay and Elyria. Marion does not have a wrestling squad. Admiral King and Lorain Senior are competing for the first time.

Three years ago, the first BC tournament was held at Fremont.

Last year's results saw Elyria win with 96 points. Mansfield had 64, Fremont 63, Findlay 61 and Sandusky 23.

Four defending champions are returning, one being Fremont's Gary Meggett, who won in the 103-pound class in 1963 but now is competing in the 112 - pound division. Meggett is undefeated this year.

Elyria's Walter Keith returns to defend his 154-pound title and Elyria's Tom Ternes, who took the 122-pound class last year, is back trying for the same title. Ron Parr of Mansfield is the fourth returning champion. He won in the 175-pound division but now wrestles as a heavyweight.

Both Fremont and Elyria are undefeated in dual competition this season. Considered strong among the seven-squad field are Fremont, Elyria and Findlay.

Ross has defeated Sandusky in dual action and placed third in the Mansfield Invitational, two notches above the Senior high Tygers.

Elyria Cops Buckeye Title:

Meggitt, Frantz Mat Champions

Elyria high won the team title but Fremont Ross, third in the point standings, came up with two Buckeye Conference wrestling champions here Saturday night during the Third Annual BC Wrestling tournament. About 500 persons watched as Elyria for the third consecutive season copped the team championship and took home a trophy presented by meet manager John Tittsworth. Elyria won with 84 points.

Following in order were Mansfield 73, Fremont 72, Findlay 43, Sandusky 28, Lorain Admiral King 21 and Lorain Senior four. Marion Hordern does not have a mat crew. Fremont Conference Champions are Gary Meggitt, the undefeated little dynamo in the 112-pound class, and Senior Mike Frantz, the 133-pound veteran. Meggitt is a defending champion from 1963, although then he won in the 103-pound division.

Three of the four defending champions came back to post victories. Only Tom Terres in the 120-pound class failed to repeat. Ron Parr of Lorain Admiral King won again, as did Ron Parr of Mansfield. Parr won last season in the 175 weight but returned to conquer in the heavyweight division.

Winning consolation matches for Fremont were Leon Lomax in the 127-pound weight, Gary Stiger in the 138 - division and Dick Nitschke in the heavyweight. Nitschke trailed big Nate Hagins, the strong Elyria fullback in last year's grid season, by a 2-0 count in the second period when suddenly the improved Fremont grappler turned the tables on the Pioneer and pinned his man.

Nosed out of championship matches were Bruce Norton (103), Chuck Scharte (120), and Jim Haas (165).

of Findlay and a decision over Sandusky, Lomax beat Mansfield but lost to Elyria, Frantz pinned Sandusky and decision from Mansfield, Stiger bye and loss to Sandusky, Jim Martinis win over Admiral King, loss to Mansfield, Ed Smith a loss to Findlay, Hass won over Findlay and had a bye, Joe Gross loss to Mansfield and Nitschke a victory over Sandusky but a loss to Findlay.
