

Ross girls seeded for BC tournament

The Buckeye Conference Girls Tennis Tournament will be played at Findlay Saturday beginning at 10 a.m.

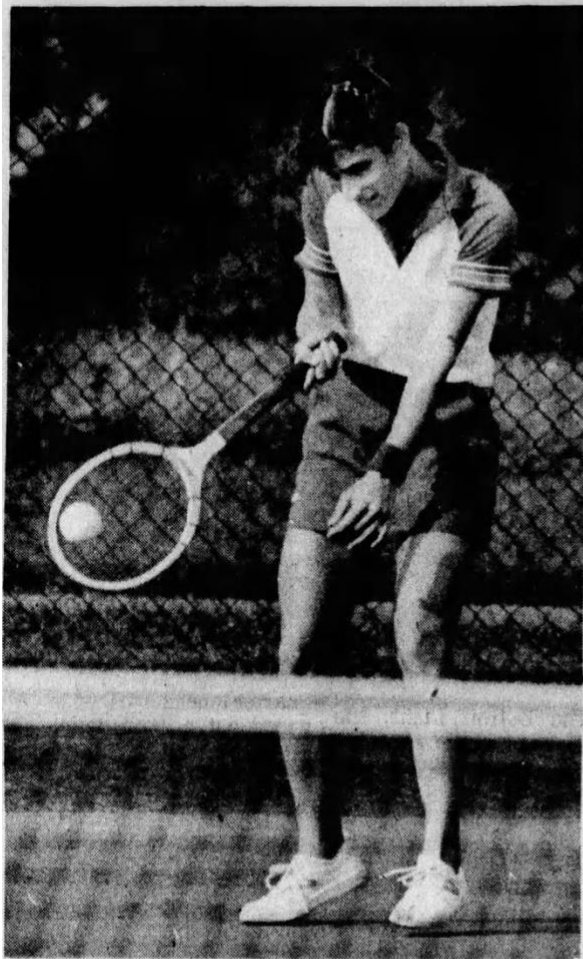
All three Ross singles players and both doubles teams were seeded for the tourney. Two drew top-seeded berths.

Brigid Heid, a sophomore and sporting an 11-1 record, is seeded first in the third singles court and will face Kim Edreff of Admiral King in her first match. Peggy Meek and Diane Shurmer, second doubles team, is Ross's other first seed. The duo will face Laura Fobselius and Kay Durk of Elyria in the first round.

Emily Heid, first singles, of Ross will face Georgina Ortega of Admiral King in the first round. She is seeded third.

In second court singles, Gretchen Jefferson is seeded second for the Lady Little Giants. She will take on Jennifer Margolis of Admiral King in her first match.

Jodi Farver and Wanda Chlosta of Ross were the third seeds in the first court doubles. They will play Robin Cantelli and Sue Gilliam of Sandusky.

Ross girls 2nd in BC tourney

FINDLAY — Fremont Ross took second in the Buckeye Conference Girls Tennis Tournament Saturday.

Host Findlay took the title with 110 points while the Lady Little Giants tallied 88. Lorain was third with 70 and Sandusky took fourth with 58. Marion Harding, Admiral King and Elyria (tie) and Mansfield rounded out the standings.

Brigid Heid won the third court singles title for Ross. Now 15-0 at the position, Heid defeated Laura Hart of Sandusky in the finals 6-2 and 6-1. Her most difficult match was in the semi-final round against Sara Miles of Findlay.

In that match, Heid had to win a third set tiebreaker 5-2 to advance to the finals. She had lost the first set 6-3 but won the second 6-1 for going into the fateful final set.

Ross had seconds in the first singles and the second doubles. Findlay had champions in the first and second singles and the second doubles.

Emily Heid took second in the first court singles for Ross. She lost to Findlay's Julie Adams 6-3 and 6-1. In the semis, Heid had edged Geri Biddle of Sandusky 3-6, 7-5 and 6-4.

Peggy Meek and Diane Shurmer, Ross's top-seeded second court doubles team, lost to Findlay's duo of Ruth Gaberman and Connie Ross 6-3 and 6-2 in the finals. In the semifinals, Meek and Shurmer stopped Ellen Waldock and Ann Stauffer of Harding 6-1, 4-6 and 6-2.

Gretchen Jefferson picked up 10 points for Ross with a win the first round of the second singles. In the second round, however, Jefferson lost to Mary Gidich of Lorain 7-6, 2-6 and 6-2.

In the first doubles, Ross's Jodi Farver and Wanda Cholosta finished third, defeating Elyria's team of Judy Julman and Kim Mealwitz 10-0 in the pro set scoring.
