# Lancaster earns BCC golf championship

FINDLAY — Lancaster finished 10 shots in front of Findlay in the Buckeye Central Conference Golf Tournament Saturday, while Fremont Ross placed fourth at Findlay Country Club.

"The teams were all better than we thought they were," Ross coach Dave Fleming said.

The Golden Gales finished with 313 shots followed by Findlay (323), Newark (325), Ross (334) and Zanesville (371).

"I knew that Lancaster had two good kids (Ogilvie and Cody Sundberg), but then they came through with a 78 and an 80," Fleming said. "I think the kids were surprised."

Lancaster's Joey Ogilvie won a one-hole playoff with Findlay's Bruce Waddell for medalist honors. Ogilvie and Waddell each shot a 76 in regulation at the par-72 course.

Chad Turben supported Ogilvie with a 78, Sundberg shot 79 and Nick Kennedy carded an 80 for Lancaster.

Mark Gottron led Ross with an 80, and Chad Baker shot 81 for the Little Giants. Ryan Riedmaier and Dan Swaisgood shot 86 and 87, respectively.

Joey Ogilvie, Sundberg, Waddell, Findlay's Paul Palmer (79) and Newark's Ryan Beeney (77) and Alan Kincaid (79) were named All-BCC.

Gottron and Baker were named to the all-conference second team.
