Root takes first, Franks third in 18-team invitational

TIFFIN — Aaron Root captured the 215-pound championship Tuesday at the Wendy's Invitational, helping Fremont Ross to an 11th place finish at the 18-team event.

Sandusky Perkins won the meet with 233.5 points, beating second place Elyria Catholic by 79 points. Kettering Fairmont finished third, followed by Piqua and Tiffin Columbian.

Root, a senior, pinned Piqua's

Jason Holfinger in 3:09 to win his weight class. Earlier Tuesday Root defeated Joe Ranker of host Tiffin Columbian, and Root beat Lexington's Jeff Steib and Kettering Fairmont's Kevin Stringer in the preliminary rounds Monday.

Though Root was the only Little Giant wrestler to go unbeaten, two of his teammates placed.

Cody Franks took third at 130 pounds and Derek Wensinger was fifth in the 125 class.

Franks, who lost to Toledo St. Francis' Tony Sbrocchi in his second match Monday, won four consecutive matches in the consolation bracket to take third. Franks won a 6-3 decision against Tiffin Columbian's Maxum Tomaszewski in the consolation final.

Wensinger defeated wrestlers from Toledo Whitmer and San-

dusky Perkins to make the championship semifinals, where he lost to Elyria Catholic's Ed Cecil. In his first consolation matchup Wensinger lost a 6-5 decision to Tiffin Columbian's Brad Mesnard before beating Perkins' Roy Villalon to claim fifth place.

Perkins, which competes in the Sandusky Bay Conference, had three individual champions, equaling the amount won by Elyria Catholic.

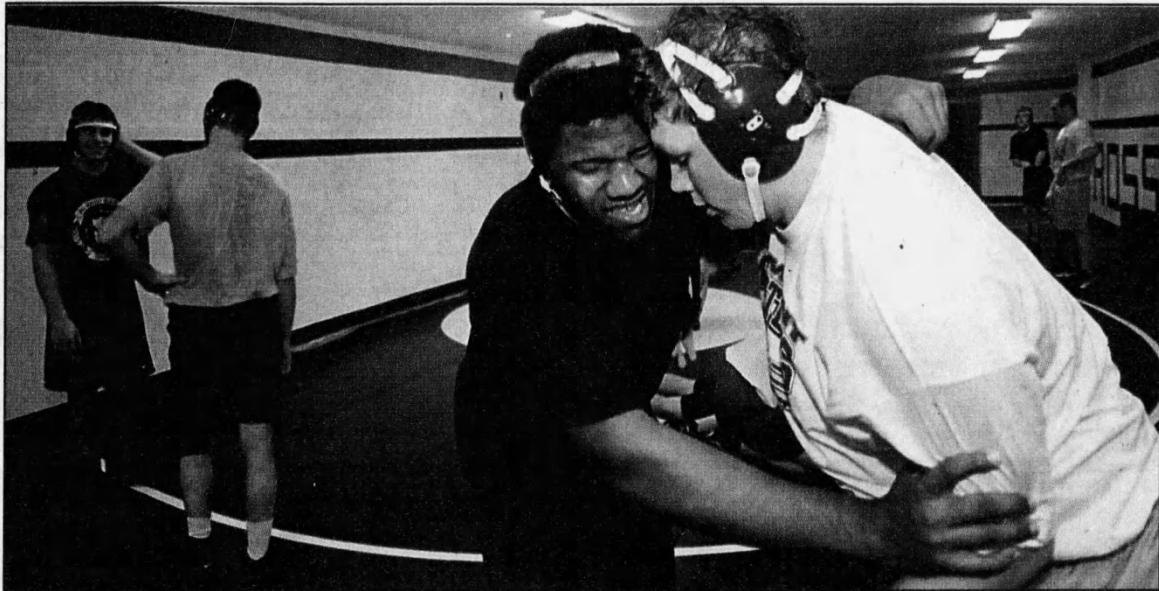

First-year wrestlers crack varsity lineup for Giants

Fremont Ross is counting on help from newcomers to win a 25-year old wrestling tournament.

Brian Hill and Roy Zamarriga, who have won half their matches despite a lack of wrestling experience, will be among the Little Giants competing when the Mal Mackey Invitational begins at 11 a.m. Saturday in the Purple Pit.

Port Clinton, Sandusky St. Mary's, Northwood, Otsego, Sylvania Southview, Lima Shawnee and Euclid will try to stop Ross from winning its fifth straight title.

"Roy and Brian have never wrestled before and they're really picking stuff up," Ross coach Grover Dowell said. "You can't ask for much more than what they're doing."

Hill, a junior, decided to wrestle at the urgings of friend and new teammate Aaron Root.

"I get to wrestle around, let out a lot of anger," said Hill, who has worked closely with assistant coach Don Wensinger. "They keep teaching me a lot of moves."

Hill split four heavyweight matches Dec. 29-30 at the Wendy's Invitational in Tiffin, his first varsity action. Zamarriga, a 103-pounder, is 3-3.

"I just want to know how I will do," Hill said.

If the newcomers need advice on what to expect at the Mal Mackey, they can turn to veterans like Cody Franks and Jesse Sandoval.

"You're in front of your home crowd and you want to go out there and do your best," said Franks, who is 12-5 at 130 pounds.

"It's at home, so that makes it more comfortable ... you get to have more family there," said Sandoval, a 171-pounder with a 10-3 record.

Aaron Root is also wrestling well at 215 pounds.

"Cody Franks and Aaron Root are doing a nice job," Dowell said. "I feel that Tyler Lawrence, Jesse Sandoval and Eric Lindsey should do a nice job."

Dowell, who is in his sixth season at Ross, lost his first Mal Mackey Invitational. He hasn't lost since.

"Whoever wins this tournament has to have a couple champions and five or six kids place," Dowell said. "Port Clinton is doing a nice job this year. I think Sandusky St. Mary's and Ross should be in the hunt."

The Mal Mackey Invitational, which began as a junior varsity event, turns 25 this year.

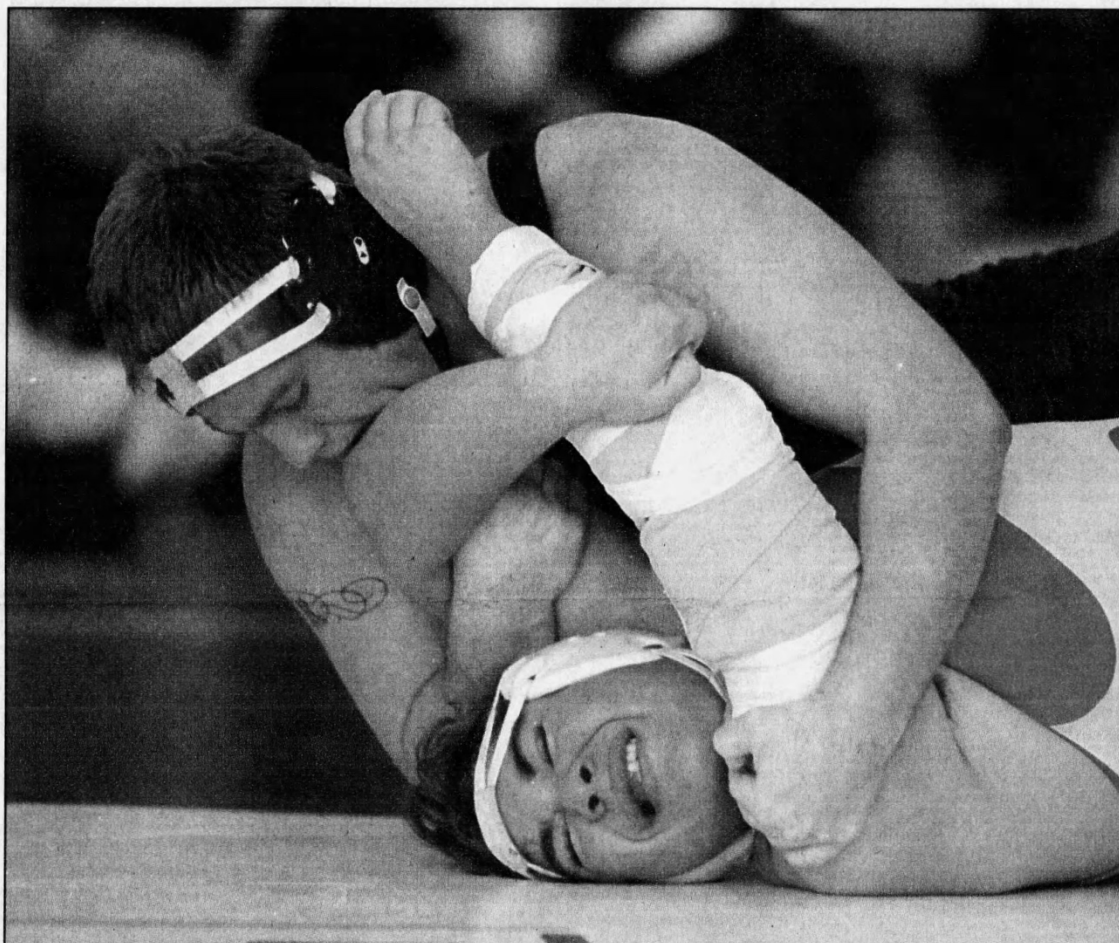
Named for the legendary Ross wrestling coach, the tournament has taken place at Ross every year since 1974.

For current Little Giants coach Grover Dowell, the event has a special meaning.

"Mal Mackey was my coach at Ross, and because of him I'm back," said Dowell, in his sixth season at Ross. "Coach Mackey was very forceful. Rough. And did it his way."

Gary Horn of Fremont participated in the first Mackey, losing a decision to Findlay's Dave Leach in the 105-pound class. Saturday's event will mark the second year Horn is working at the event.

11 Giants place at tourney

Aaron Root and Derek Wensinger's second-place finishes a year ago boosted Fremont Ross to a narrow win in the Mal Mackey Memorial Wrestling Tournament.

This year, the duo helped make it a blowout.

Root, Wensinger, Tyler Lawrence and Josh Martin all captured championships Saturday as Ross won its fifth straight Mal Mackey title.

Competing in the 25th-annual event, the host Little Giants scored 181 points and outdistanced second place Euclid (150). Shawnee was third in the eight-team event with 145.5.

Seven Ross wrestlers made the finals and four others took

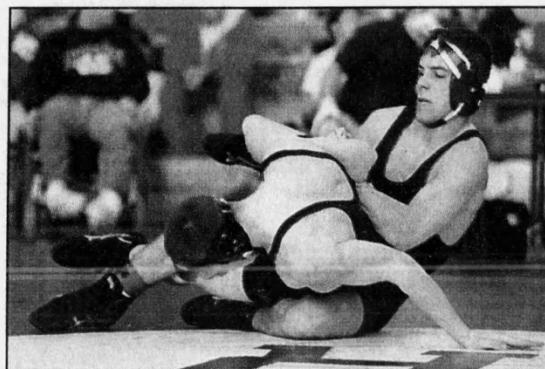
third place.

"I can't really single any individual effort because when you come out and have thirteen (wrestlers) going into the tournament and eleven place, I can't take anything away from that," Ross coach Grover Dowell said. "I'm just happy with the way we wrestled."

Root decisioned Shawnee's Mark Leifer 13-6 to win the 215-pound title.

"I got my moves down a lot better this year, my double legs, I hit my back-switch good, and that's something I work on a lot in practice because it has gotten me out of some tough situations," Root said. "And I'm more in shape."

Wensinger pinned Port Clinton's David Schwan in 2:25 to

win the 125-pound division.

Lawrence, a winner at 140 in 1997, decisioned Mike Forman of Sylvania Southview 9-2 to capture the 145-pound title.

Martin rallied from a 6-1 deficit to overtake Justin McKillips of St. Mary's and win

the 152-pound championship with a 17-9 decision.

Roy Zamarripa, J.R. Adkins and Jesse Sandoval were runners-up in their respective weight classes.

In a rematch of last year's 160 finalists, Ross 171-pounder Jesse Sandoval lost a 9-2 decision to Mike Dominick of Euclid. Dominick was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Wrestler.

"I weighed in at 165 today so I had an opportunity to go down to 160, but I chose not to," Sandoval said. "(Dominick) is a really good wrestler and I have to give him credit for that. He beat me last year in overtime (10-8).

"He's strong and quick and that's a really good combination for a 171-pounder."

Zamarripa, in his first season of competitive wrestling, was pinned by Sandusky St. Mary's Matt Finneran at the 3:13 mark in the 103 championship.

Adkins lost to Tony Briggs of Lima Shawnee in the 160 finals after turning in an impressive performance in the semifinals, where he pinned Otsego's Keith Bitteringer in 40 seconds to advance.

In the consolation finals, Ross's Cody Franks placed third at 130 by winning by default over Chris Bergman of Port Clinton. Kyle Iliff decisioned Louie Codu-

ti of Northwood to secure third place at 135 and Eric Lindsey captured a 21-4 technical fall decision over Dave D'Amico of Euclid to finish third at 189.

The Little Giants Brian Hill rounded out the team scoring by pinning Port Clinton's Kerry Kemp in the consolation finals of the 275 pound weight class.

The win was Ross's 10th in the history of the event.

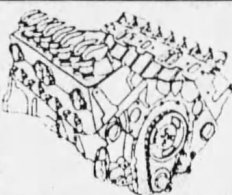
Three of the eight teams, including Ross, were Division I schools, while three more were

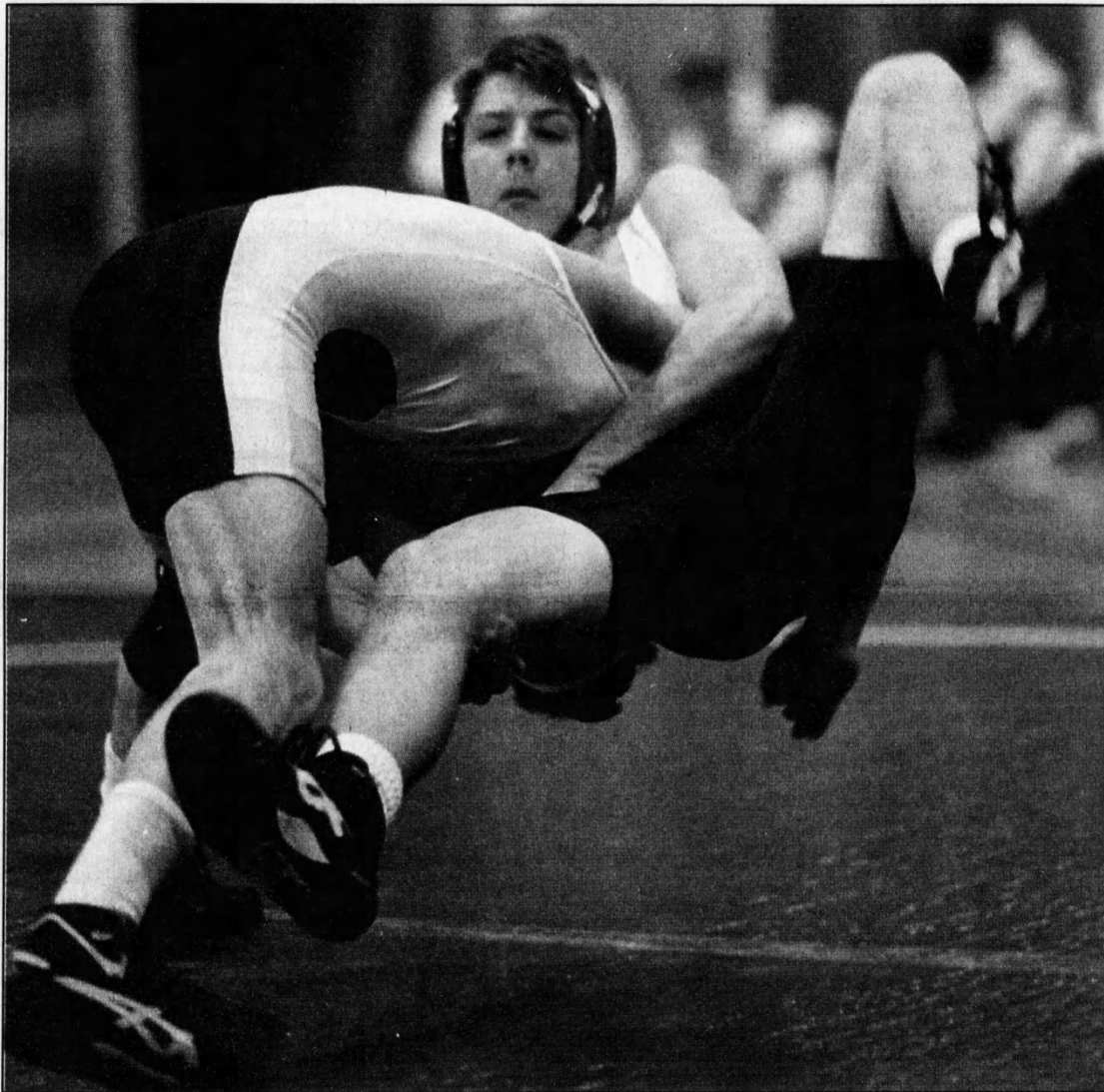

Little Giants fall short in dual meet with rival Sandusky

Sandusky jumped out to a 20-point lead and managed to hold off Ross 43-31 in dual meet wrestling action Wednesday night at Ross.

The Little Giants got as close as 34-25 before Sandusky's Jimmie Cherry clinched at least a tie for Sandusky in a key match with Ross's Eric Lindsey in the 189-pound match.

The match was knotted at 4-4 after two periods, but Cherry began the third by

reversing Lindsey and getting a near fall to lead 9-4.

The Little Giant grappler scored a reversal before Cherry took a 9-6 win.

Sandusky took a 37-25 lead in the team score and went on to post the win over the Little Giants.

Ross coach Grover Dowell said the 189-pound match was just a part of the Fremont loss.

"We didn't lose it in one match, we lost it all the way through," Dowell said.

Senior Aaron Root (215) entered his

match knowing what was at stake.

"I was kind of psyched up after that match, I knew with two pins we could tie it," Root said.

He got his 11th pin of the season by downing Sandusky's John Rosekelly in 1:12 to pull Fremont within 37-31.

But Eric Gibson of Sandusky pinned Ross's Ryan Cooley in the 275-pound division to clinch the victory.

Lawrence flipped Davis after a takedown to go up 10-2 in the third period.

"That opened up, so I just turned him and went for the pin."

Josh Martin then scored a 14-5 major decision over Sandusky's Dustin Davis at 152.

And Ross teammate Jessie Sandoval flattened Chaz Tiller in 53 seconds in their 171-pound match.

Despite the victory, the Ross senior said it was hard to leave the Fremont-Blue Streak rivalry.

"It's kinda tough with me being a senior for it to end like this," he said. "Our season is not over. Even though it is a big rivalry, we just have to keep working at it."
