Ross swimmers continue hot start

PORT CLINTON — The future is so bright for the Ross girls swimming program, coach Tina Moses might have to wear shades.

Fresh off a third-place showing at the 48-team Ned Reed Invitational at Ohio State over the weekend, the Little Giants had another good showing on Tuesday at Port Clinton, topping the Redskins 107-79. Included in the effort was a new Port Clinton pool record swim by the 200 yard freestyle relay of Holly Phillips, Morgan Waggoner, Haley Fisher and Laura Duncan, which swam a time of 1:41.71.

Ross earned the sweep as the boys team earned a 130-49 victory.

"We're doing great right now," Moses said. "This past weekend was a huge weekend for us in Columbus, and to finish as high as we did with the competition that's there, that's an amazing accomplishment for us. And to be setting school and pool records this time of year is just unheard of."

Ross' 400 free relay of Megan Hawk, Waggoner, Haley Fisher and Meghan Moses set a new school record this past Saturday with a mark of 3:36.32.

For Waggoner, a freshman, it was particularly sweet because she got to do it in front of her sis-

ter, Taylor, a swimmer for the Buckeyes.

"She's been a big influence. I definitely want to be like her," Morgan said. "She was there to see it, and she was giving me advice the whole time."

At first, there was a little confusion as to whether the swim was a record or not.

"We all were trying to figure out what the record was and if we actually did break it," Meghan said. "It was exciting when we figured out that it was."

Meghan, another Ross freshman, was in the top 10 of both the 50 and 100 free races in Columbus. On Tuesday, she was runner-up in both the 100 free and 100 backstroke. She, Waggoner,

Duncan and Hawk won the 400 free relay.

"I love high school," Meghan said. "It's definitely a different experience from USA Swimming, which I've done for the last seven years."

But swimming for your mom can a challenge in itself.

"She treats me like everyone else," Meghan said. "She definitely will get on me if I'm messing up. She's one of the best coaches I've had."

Haley Fisher won the 200 free Tuesday and was second in the 100 breaststroke. Duncan won the 200 individual medley and took third in the 100 free be-

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hind Moses, while Waggoner won the 100 butterfly and finished runner-up in the 50 free. Phillips earned the top spot 100 backstroke and was second to Duncan in the 200 IM.

“We swam a lot of off-events tonight that the girls aren’t used to swimming,” coach Moses said. “The 500 was definitely our standout event.”

Hawk set a new PR in the 500 with a winning time of 5:47.27. Freshman Alaina Klingman, second, was within a second of her best time (5:51.84), while sophomore Kortni Lagrou broke her best with a swim of 6:07.98.

Erin Seefus was second in diving to Port Clinton’s Emily Zibert (162.40 to 148.65).

On the boys side, freshman Trent Williams and seniors Scott Kosakowski and Graham Moor and Chris Hoffman each won two individual events and were part of winning relays.

Williams won the 100 fly, 200 IM and swam the lead on the winning 200 medley and 200 free relay teams. Kosakowski won the 100 backstroke 200 free and took part on the winning 200 medley and 400 free relay squads with Moor who won the 500 free and 100 breaststroke.

Hoffman was the fourth member of the 200 medley and 200 free squad, he also won the 50 free and 100 free.

Moor grabs more

Little Giants' senior earns Top Male Performer honors

FREMONT — Graham Moor continues to make a name for himself in the pool for Ross.

The Little Giants' senior shared Top Male Performer honors at Saturday's swim finals of the Daniel H. Lease Little Giant Invitational at the Hawk-Bucci Natatorium. Ross finished second as a group in the 18-team field to Findlay, 592-445.

Moor won the 100-yard butterfly with a time of 53.48, took second in the 200 freestyle (1:49.10) and teamed with Trent Williams, Scott Kosakowski and Chris Hoffman to place second in the both the 200 and 400 free relays.

"Going into it, and looking at everything, I didn't even think about it," said Moor, asked of what it was like to be only the second Ross swimmer, the other being Lincoln Fahrback, to win the honor of Top Male Performer at his team's own meet. "Scott Kosakowski brought it up and was like, 'you could get swimmer of the meet dude.' Once I realized that, I was gunning for it.

"It's just a great honor."

Moor had plenty of fast company as schools, such as Sandusky, Wapakoneta, Sylvania Southview, Perrysburg and Bowling Green took part in the two-day meet.

"He had a really good meet," Ross boys coach Phil Moran said. "That was his fastest time in the 200 this season, and his fly time was really good. It was faster than his shaved and tapered time last year at districts. Plus, it was a close race, which was great also."

On the girls side, Ross freshman Morgan Waggoner set a new meet record of 59.57 seconds in the 100 backstroke, as part of four first-place efforts.

The Little Giants earned the team title with 510 points — 202 points ahead of runner-up Perrysburg.

Waggoner had yet to break 1:00 in the backstroke, a goal of hers since the seventh grade.

"I didn't think I was going to go that fast," she said. "This morning, I didn't feel too good. I was really sore."

The Little Giants are currently going through "Hell Week."

"The name speaks for it-

self," Moor said. "We're not having an easy day any time during this week. But it's all for the end of the year."

Because of the holiday break, Moran and girls coach Tina Moses were able to schedule double practice sessions this past week.

"The other day we finished our 8,700 yards with a 500 fly, which they didn't really like," Moran said. "But it's one of the mental things where I'm trying to see how mentally tough they are."

Kosakowski took second for the Little Giants in the 200 individual medley.

Trent Williams was third in the 100 backstroke, while Chris Hoffman had a pair of fourth-place swims in the 50 and 100 free races. Nickolas Hoffman was fourth in the 200 IM and fifth in the 100 fly.

"The boys swam really well today," Moran said. "Finishing second to Findlay is pretty cool. The younger kids dropped a ton of time, which might be bad for them, because that means I can work them harder now for another week."

Waggoner won the 100 fly for the Ross girls. She, Holly

Phillips, Laura Duncan and Emily Moyer won the 200 medley relay. Waggoner, Meghan Moses, Haley Fisher and Megan Hawk won the 400 free relay.

Fisher, Hawk, Duncan and Moses won the 200 free relay. Moses took second in the 50 free and third in the 100 free, while Fisher was second in each the 100 backstroke and the 200 IM.

Phillips was third in the 100 backstroke, giving the Little Giants a one, two, three finish.

Duncan added thirds in the 100 breaststroke and 100 fly.

"To swimming this fast, during a week like this, was fantastic," coach Moses said.

St. Joseph Central Catholic finished 18th in the 27-team girls field.

Leah Binsack won the B-final of the 50 free with a time of 26.99 seconds. She, Caroline Darr, Brigitte Fulwider and Kristin Sessler also competed in the B-finals of the 200 and 400 free relays, winning the 400 race at 4:25.66.

Fulwider was seventh in the B-final of the 100 breaststroke.

Duncan won the 500-yard freestyle in 5:38.67, beating out teammate Kortni Lagrou. She added a second-place effort in the 200 medley relay with

The Little Giants were dominant in the boys’ races as well.

Moor gets the last laugh

Ross senior swimmer signs to swim at Wright State

FREMONT — Ross' Graham Moor looks every bit the part of what one pictures a college swimmer to look like.


Outside the water, he's got the lean body and toned muscles. Inside, his speed and grace in the water is just as impressive. He finished his Little Giants' career as one of the

fastest swimmers in program history, placing well within the top 10 times in each of his events, adding an elusive trip to Canton to compete in the Division I state meet in February.

But the Ross senior admits observers use to get a much different impression of the Little Giant who signed to swim at Wright State University on Monday.

"Today was the culmination

of eight-plus years of me basically just working my tail off," Moor said. "For most of my swimming career, I was the tubby kid. I still have the eight-pack that everybody else has, but it really wasn't until beginning of sophomore that I started taking swimming seriously to the point where I realized I could do something with it.

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"At the end of my freshman year, I qualified to districts in the 100 butterfly and the 200 freestyle and I didn't expect that, especially as a freshman and being the fat kid. From there on out, my abilities just increased, especially my junior year when I really came on the swim scene."

Moor earned first-team all-Three Rivers Athletic Conference honors as a junior and qualified to districts in four events. However, when the season came to an abrupt end at districts, it was all tears and disappointment on the swim deck of Bowling Green State University's Cooper Pool. Moor could only muster a fifth-place run in the 100 fly and a eighth-place effort in the 200 free. But it was his shortcoming with his teammates in the relays that hit home the most as he had to watch a good friend, Keith Wasserman, come up short of a trip to Canton in his final season.

"That was one of the worst moments of my life," Moor

said. "We were so close as a group and we had worked so hard, but it was over. There was just a lot of emotions that day."

Emotions that turned into tools for motivation.

"There wasn't much left for him to do here as a senior," Ross boys swim coach Phil Moran said. "I just told him, 'hey, here's what we got to do.' But he put the hard work into it and he was able to accomplish those goals this year, so I was happy for him."

Moor had hold himself back from splashing around, much like Michael Phelps did at the Olympics in Beijing, China, when he out-touched St. Francis de Sales's anchor in the 400 free relay to earn his team the TRAC championship on Jan. 20. He added a TRAC title in the 100 fly to his list. But he shocked everyone, including his coach, when he earned district runner-up in the 200 free to qualify to state with a time of 1:43.41.

"I was so ecstatic and I asked all the other coaches that were around, 'I betcha you didn't pick him for second?' Moran said. "They all said they didn't have him even in the picture.

He swam that race for the first time correctly at districts the way it's suppose to be swum."

He also qualified in the 100 fly and much to happiness, he and fellow seniors Scott Kosakowski and Chris Hoffman made it in the 200 free relay, along with freshman Trent Williams. The four had a swim-off to earn all-state status with a 14th-place finish.

"Those were clutch moments I'll remember for the rest of my life," said Moor, of the big finishes his senior year.

Moor will join former Ross teammates Bobby Carnicom and Sammi Miller at Wright State. He'll major in management information systems.

"Seeing Sammi and Bobby down there is definitely going to be a nice way to warm up," Moor said. "On my couple of recruiting visits I've already made some good friends on the team. But it's going to be great to be with Bobby again."

The Raiders, coached by Sion Brinn, were fifth at this year's Horizon League championships.

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
