# Ross, St. Joe athletes thrilled about return of invitational

The Fremont Ross and St. Joseph Central Catholic track and field teams sure appreciate the die-hard parents and well-wishers who cross-carry northwest Ohio to watch them run, throw and jump.

But the Little Giants and Crimson Streaks are hoping to see a few unfamiliar faces when they host the 38th annual Fremont Invitational on Saturday at the Alumni Field complex.

The invitational is back after a two-year hiatus made necessary by the resurfacing

of the Ross High School track. It's the most fan-friendly of the Little Giants' three home meets — the other two were on chilly Tues-

day nights — and represents the Streaks' only appearance in their hometown.

The athletes are treating the meet as a showcase.

"It's one of the greatest feelings," said Xavier Darden, a senior sprinter at Ross. "Last year, we didn't have a track, so we didn't have any home meets. Now you get to have your fans and family come out and see you. It's exciting."

Said St. Joe distance runner Mike Chapman: "I'm pretty excited. I haven't run in a home meet. It'll be great."

Field events begin at 9:30 a.m. Saturday, and track

events begin at 9:45 a.m. Finals start at 1 p.m.

Joining Ross and St. Joe will be Clyde, Sandusky, Defiance, Toledo Central Catholic, Hopewell-Loudon, Tiffin Calvert and Fostoria St. Wendelin.

There are several subplots in the invitational, including a much-anticipated sprinting duel between Ross's Kelly Lytle and Clyde's Ben Caudill and the ongoing competition between Ross sprinter Fallon Bailey and Sandusky counterpart Tamala Perryman.

As one of the smallest schools at the meet, St. Joe

is unlikely to compete for a team championship. But the Streaks hope their top athletes will gain from competing against bigger schools.

Of course, as Lytle joked Wednesday, "Track meets are like a box of chocolates: You never know what you're going to get."

The Ross and St. Joe athletes also are using the invitational as a final tune-up before the league and district meets the next two weekends.

"That's one of the reasons I'm looking forward to this meet," Chapman said. "It will pull along our times to

face good competition. This will probably be our most competitive meet to date."

Athletes from the two schools appreciate the new track, completed late last season but not in time for regular-season meets. They point to better practice facilities for working on starts and specialty events like high and long jumping.

"It can really make a difference," Ross's Tanesha McKinstry said of the facilities.

"We're happy with what we have now," Darden said. "From what we had to what we have now is a big difference. Thank you, Fremont."

seconds. The 4x200 team, which consisted of the same runners, took first in 1:46.10. And the 4x400 team of Sweeney, Delana Simms, Bailey and McKinstry finished the meet strong with a victory in 4:18.60.

"They didn't have this meet my freshman and sophomore years, so it was nice to run this year," Baley said. "I won four events, so I guess it was more than I expected."

Ross also got a victory from McKinstry in the 200 dash (26.17) and second-place finishes from Sweeney in the 400 dash (1:03.01), high jumper Sashay Price (5-2), shot-putter Jennifer Hillier (34-11.75) discus thrower Jamie Smith (114-9) and freshman Wendy Farrell in the 3,200 run (13:14.97).

"It's very satisfying for the girls," Opelt said, "that they started back in the winter and to see that they came out and scored

that many points today against this competition."

Darden picked up a victory for the Ross boys in the 400 dash (50.03) and teammate Allen Lutes won in the long jump (20-1.5). Hurdler Greg Burroughs returned from an early-season foot injury to lead the second-place finishers for Ross. Burroughs (15.21) barely lost out to Sandusky's Nate Matthews (15.20) in the 110 hurdles.

The St. Joe girls got a victory from Joni Wilhelm in the 800 run (2:25.70) and the 4x800 relay team of Kerri Zimmerman, Trischa Snyder, Lindsay Smith and Wilhelm, earned a victory (10:07.20).

"The distance girls ran well," St. Joe coach Eddie Colon said. "It was a tough competitive meet. We need meets like that."

"The kids did a good job. Even though their minds might have been on prom, they did what they were supposed to do."

For the St. Joe boys, senior

Mike Chapman turned in his best time of the season in finishing fourth in a tough 1,600 run. But he came back and won the 3,200 run to close out his high school career.

"On my last two laps, I started thinking about running my last meet at Fremont," Chapman said. "I haven't run too many meets here, but it was special to go out with a win."

Evan Czisman recorded St. Joe's lone second-place finish with a pole vault of 11-6.

Clyde failed to win an event, but the Fliers got second-place finishes from Rickie Greiner in the 300 hurdles (41.30) and the 4x1,600 relay team.

"It was good to run against this tougher competition," Clyde coach Mike Martin said. "Our places weren't what we hoped they'd be, but our times were good. That should help us in the SEC and the postseason. We won't see these teams again."

# No doubt: Lytle back on track

**Sprinter shatters Ross's 100 mark**

Last fall, Ross sprinter Kelly Lytle walked gingerly around the Alumni Field track, taking the first steps toward recovery from a serious knee injury he suffered in a summer basketball game.

If he had any doubt back then about whether his speed would return, it was erased for good on the same track Saturday at the 38th Fremont Invitational.

Lytle lit up his home track in the 100-meter dash on the way to a school record and an easy victory over Durond Clark of Sandusky and Ben Caudill of Clyde.

Lytle's time of 10.5 seconds beat the five-year-old Ross record of 10.6 seconds held by Jason Lather.

"I've been shooting for this since last year," Lytle said. "It means a lot. I think it was partly the competition. I was a little bit surprised I won that easily."

The invitational returned Saturday after a two-year absence necessitated by the resurfacing of the Ross track. The conditions — a burning sun and temperatures that reached the mid-80s — gave the athletes their first taste of weather they may see in the regional and state meets later this season.

The Ross girls won their half of the invitational, helped along by four victories from junior sprinter Fallon Bailey.

But it was Lytle's day, even though the Little Giant boys came in third behind Sandusky and Toledo Central Catholic.

Helped by a soft tail breeze, Lytle won the 100 by about

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four steps over Clark. He immediately raised his arms in triumph, aware that he had done something special. After results were announced, Lytle's father, former NFL player and volunteer track coach Rob Lytle, crossed the track to hug his wife.

"He really deserves it,"

Ross coach Jeff Opelt said. "I could tell in the prelims, when he cruised through in 11 seconds (10.93) without even trying, it was going to be a good day."

"When a junior puts that much time in — I mean in the rain and the snow — to rehabilitate, it's great to see. I remember seeing him walking around the track last fall. I'm really

happy for him and his family."

Lytle also took the 200 dash (21.93 seconds) and ran on the Little Giants' winning 4x100 relay along with Xavier Darden, David Rhodes and Jose Simms (43.10 seconds).

The Ross boys scored 83.8 points. Sandusky won with 113 points and Toledo Central Catholic was second with 87 points. Among local boys

teams, Clyde was sixth with 46.3 points and St. Joseph Central Catholic was seventh with 33 points.

The Little Giant girls took home the championship trophy by scoring 121 points, beating second-place Defiance by 14. St. Joe was fifth with 46 points, and Clyde was seventh with 12 points.

Conspicuous by its absence

was the Sandusky girls team. The Blue Streaks canceled earlier in the week because its prom was Saturday. Still, the Sandusky boys attended the meet, as did the St. Joe boys and girls, who also had prom Saturday. The Blue Streaks scored two points, thanks to a runner who came to Fremont on her own.

Bailey won the 100 dash in 11.90 seconds, tying the school record for the second time this season. She also ran on Ross's three winning relay teams. The 4x100 team of Tiffany Sweeney, Adrienne Robertson, Taneshia McKinstry and Bailey won in 50.80
