It was a close, exciting season and I'm really looking forward to next year." The two co-captains, Julie Young and Lisa Manahan, added their feelings about the season. Ross tennis team rebuilding again

When you talk with Pete Michaels, you may think you are listening to a broken record.

"It's a rebuilding year," he said Monday while talking about his Ross High School girls tennis team. "We expect to be in a lot of 3-2 matches."

He only grinned when he was reminded that he's been making that statement for several seasons.

"We do have problems with the doubles teams," Michaels, who guided the Little Giants to a 10-5 dual match record and a fourth place in the Buckeye

Conference in 1985, said. "We have several girls fighting for positions on those teams."

The three singles alignments are set for today's (four o'clock) season opening match with Tiffin Columbian at the Rodger Young Park courts.

Julie Young, a letter-winning junior, will play in the first court singles while Jennifer Miesle, another junior, will draw the assignment in the second court singles.

One of only two seniors on the team, Lisa Manahan, will be at third singles.

It's the doubles alignments

that the veteran Ross coach is pondering. He lists Fostoria senior transfer Sherrie Hathaway and juniors Kim White, Sarah Hull, Tricia Shirvis, Jennifer McKnight and Laura Jay as having shots at playing on either of the two doubles team.

"I hope to come up with them (the two teams) out of that group," Michaels said.

Rounding out the 13-member team are sophomore Diane Roth and freshmen Dian Schepflin, Kelly Warner and Irene Sheen.

"They have a little ways to go before they challenge for one of the doubles positions,"

Micheales said about his four underclassmen.

"We have the same schedule as last year," Michaels explained, "and it is tough. We just look for improvement as the season goes on. As I said, we will be in a lot of 3-2 matches; we are just looking for the third point."

Monday, Michaels announced that Young and Manahan had been elected to the co-captain spots by their teammates.

After this afternoon's match, Ross will travel to Sandusky to play Perkins at 4 p.m., Wednesday, in the first of three consecutive road matches.
