Magrum's record leads Rockets

The Oak Harbor Rockets grabbed the top five spots and Glenn Magrum took first, breaking another course record to crush the Ross cross country team 15-42 in a meet at Thornwood Golf links.

Magrum finished the 2½ mile course in 12:54, beating the old record by more than six seconds, according to Ross coach Ron Brant. Magrum broke Genoa's course record on Tuesday.

Steve Anderson, the runner-up in the race, was 48 seconds behind Magrum while Jeff Arnold, Jack Quisno and Tom Hablitzel rounded

out the top five for the Rockets.

The first Little Giant runner to cross the finish line was Fred Hepp. He finished the course in 14:14 with teammate Dwayne Endicott one second behind him. Brian Humbarger grabbed eighth in 14:22.

In other cross country action, St. Joe had an easy win over Crestline 19-44 and Clyde defeated Bellevue 20-38.

St. Joe's Tom Frederick led the pack at Crestline, taking first in 14:14. Gene Toy of Crestline was second in 14:53 while St. Joe's

Chris Krice finished third in 15:17. The Crimson Streak also took the fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth and tenth spots to dominate the meet.

At Bellevue, Marty Meyer and Randy Nofzt finished one-two for Clyde in 13:37 and 13:52 respectively, to pace Clyde to its victory over Bellevue.

Brent Smith of Bellevue was third in 14:01, Willie Colavincenzo of Clyde was fourth in 14:05 and Chris Neer of Bellevue took fifth in 14:13.



Marty Meyer shattered the course record at Thornwood Golf Links to lead Clyde to a 15-50 romp over Ross in cross country Thursday afternoon. Meyer's time of 12:13 broke Glenn Magrum's record of 12:54 set earlier this year. Finishing second was Clyde's Randy Nottz in 12:57 followed by teammates Dave Rollyson in 13:14 and Bill

Colavincenzo in 13:41. St. Joe defeated Gibsonburg 25-30 and lost to Mohawk 23-32 in a triangular meet run right after the Ross meet at Thornwood Golf Links. Mohawk defeated Gibsonburg 20-35 in the other portion of the meet. Roger Drake of Mohawk nipped Tino Ramos of Gibsonburg at the finish line. Drake ran the 2½

mile course in 13:04 while Ramos was one second behind him. Third place went to St. Joe's Tom Frederick in 13:14. Magrum of Oak Harbor added another first place finish to his record this season in the Rockets 15-46 win over Woodmore. Teammates Steve Anderson and Jeff Arnold were second and third in

13:03 and 13:27 respectively. Bill Sears was the first Woodmore runner to finish, grabbing sixth place in 14:09. In a girls cross country meet, Clyde downed Bellevue 19-38. Maggie Fultz of Clyde won the race in 16:54 with Bellevue's Leah Diehr second in 17:14 and Jenny Bible of Clyde third in 18:11.
