Ross favored to win GLL golf title

The members of the Fremont Ross High School golf team are prepared to make a run at the Great Lakes League championship.

But is their short game?

"That's something we'll keep working on," Ross coach Dave Fleming said. "The kids don't work on that part of the game by themselves. They work on the driver and the long irons ... see how far they can hit the ball."

The Little Giants, third in the GLL a year ago, are the choice

of the league's coaches to win the title this fall.

"I like the pressure," Fleming said. "The kids do to. I said, 'Let's do it then.'"

Ross, which opens the season Aug. 31 against Tiffin Columbian at Mohawk Country Club, is led by three returning lettermen — senior Dave Zinkand, junior Rob Randall and sophomore Dan Grossman.

"The first three have a year's worth of experience," Fleming

said. "Last year, when they shot a bad score it was 45. This year, when they shoot a bad score it's 42. So they've brought their scores down."

Rob Hammer, an erratic but promising freshman, will fill the fourth spot on the squad.

Junior Josh Gillis as well as sophomores Justin Held, Jon Kingsborough and Kevin Kohr are battling for the fifth spot.

Kohr and Kingsborough are out for the team for the first time.

Streaks win Ross title by 20 strokes

Fremont St. Joseph Central Catholic High School golf coach Charlie Baker is looking for improvement from the Crimson Streaks.

The Streaks took the first step Saturday.

With the dual meet portion of the schedule more than half over, the Streaks began tuning up for the tournament season with a championship in the Fremont Invitational Saturday.

Led by Chad Seilheimer, easily the best golfer in the nine-team field, St. Joe finished at 326 or 20 shots better than runner-up Bellevue.

"At this stage of the season, I'm pleased with the way the team is beginning to jell," Baker said. "Today ... we became a unit."

Seilheimer's 2-over par 73 on the 6,374-yard Fremont Country Club course, was 10 shots better than the scores of Dan Grossman of Fremont Ross and Clyde's Ty Newsome.

Newsome defeated Grossman on the second hole of a sudden-death playoff for individual runner-up medalist honors.

Seilheimer had birdies on the 372-yard ninth hole and the 508-yard 13th.

"I hit a lot of shots close, but my putting was just OK," he said. "It's my home course, and

I know it so well. I really didn't have to think out there.

"I know where all the trouble is at, and I avoided it."

Ross finished third with 353, while Toledo St. Francis was another four shots back.

"The first three guys played well," Ross coach Dave Fleming said. "We need to dig up a fourth

score."

Rob Randall and Dave Zinkand backed up Grossman's 83 with 84 and 85, respectively, but the Little Giants settled for Rob Hammer's 101 for its fourth score.

St. Joe, perhaps, won the tournament on the front nine.

In addition to Seilheimer's

even-par 35, fifth-man Brian Goetz shot 39 going out in his first 18-hole high school tournament. It was also the first time Goetz had played at Fremont Country Club.

"I was so surprised (after the 39) that I went up and hugged him," Baker said. "I knew he was capable. It just exploded for him today."

Goetz's 84 was matched by Brad Darr, who survived a 10 on the 390-yard 11th hole when he took six shots to get out of a green-side bunker. Darr bounced back with a birdie on the 125-yard 12th hole, and finished with pars on the remaining holes on the back side.

"I'm happy with his ability to come back," Baker said. "That shows that we're not giving up out there."

Kevin Kayden added an 85 to St. Joe's total.

Clyde finished two strokes behind St. Francis at 359.

"We were hoping that we could come in here and finish fourth," Clyde coach Ralph Hohenstein said.

Hohenstein said each of the Fliers set out to shoot 43 on both nines.

"Except for Ty, they were all pretty disappointed," he said.

Genoa, which won the team Sportsmanship Award, finished sixth with 361. The Comets were followed by Port Clinton (388), Elyria (397) and Willard (407).
