ROSS HIGH DUE TO CHOOSE ITS MEET ENTRANTS

Try-Outs to be Held In Ohio State Meet Selection

Fremont Ross High school resumed practice Monday in preparation for the state high school track and field meet to be held in Columbus, Friday and Saturday.

While the number of events Fremont will enter in the state meet has not yet been determined, Coach Harold (Whitey) Althoff said Pete Fox would compete in the high hurdles and a medley relay team would compete, at least. Norman Keller will enter the mile.

Equals State Record

When Pete Fox broke his own high hurdles record for the sixth time this year, at Sandusky in the district meet Saturday, he equalled the state record of 15.1 seconds in that event.

Try-outs will be held this week to select members of the medley relay team. Runners will be timed, and the team picked of the fastest four. The state preliminaries will be held Friday afternoon.

Is Last Meet

The state meet will wind up the season for Fremont's track team.

The team made an excellent record, losing only meet during the season to Mansfield, and taking second in the Buckeye League and third in the District Class A competition.

Next year, Coach Althoff will have an experienced group of varsity and junior high track material to pick from. The following seniors who will be lost through graduation next month are:

Pete Fox, Lead Scorer of Season, Summary Shows

Fremont's entrance in the 30th annual state high school track and field meet, Friday and Saturday, is being watched with great interest by sports followers here.

Coach Harold (Whitey) Althoff's choices for the meet, including Pete Fox, Norm Keller and the relay runners, will be thrown into competition with the fastest company in Ohio.

The class B games were Navarre vs. Terrace Park, Troy Elizabeth Township vs. Thurston, Holgate vs. Gloucester and Pember-ville vs. Yorkville.

Track teams from 261 schools were entered in various events, 154 in class A and 107 in class B; and 14 golf teams, 16 baseball teams and 28 tennis squads.

Cleveland East Tech, class A defending track champion, qualified only eight men and two relay teams, indicating an uphill fight if it is to repeat last year's victory.

Oberlin had 10 men and three relay teams qualified for the class B events, its title going on the block under spirited competition from Upper Arlington and Dresden.

To Charles Maag, who set a new record in the discus, and Jim Rosemond, the Negro runner who made such a fine showing in the Buckeye league competition recently in Fremont, is most of the credit to individual performers due.

Rosemond sped across the 440 finish line about 15 feet ahead of his nearest competitor.

Of other district schools, Wright of Bellevue, was second to Maag in the discus.

Maag's record was 132 feet, 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches. The former record was 132 feet, 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches set by Rabb of Akron North in 1934.

Langhurt of Willard, was fourth in the high hurdles, in which event Fremont's own Pete Fox was fifth for Fremont's only point in the meet.

Oak Harbor was fifth in the mile relay team in the Class B competition.
