Mark it down

Automatic duo helps guide the tight-knit Giants

CLYDE — Fremont Ross coach Cathy Esposito can confidently pencil in returning state qualifiers Elon Simms and Adam Wilhelm as the top two runners in the 400-meter dash before each meet.

In fact, she can safely use a permanent marker.

The duo lived up to expectations on Saturday as Simms won the event and Wilhelm was second at the Clyde Invitational.

The pair also led the Little Giants to victories in the 800 and 1,600 relays and Wilhelm set a

meet record in the 200 at 22.2 seconds.

"The open 400 for Simms and Wilhelm is a nice 18 points," Esposito said. "Wilhelm's 200 was awesome today. He was strong right from the start and dominated."

"He's doing well. His strength is a lot better. He's determined to get back to state."

Ross finished second to Tiffin Columbian (133.5) as a team with 127 points in losing its first meet of the season.

"I'm proud of our second," Wilhelm said. "We could have had first if we pushed a little

harder. Our relays are really starting to improve. The chemistry is coming around."

"We're learning as we go that every meet won't be given to us," he continued. "Even though we have a lot of talent, we have to keep working."

The Giants will get another shot at Tiffin Columbian at the Tiffin Invitational on Saturday.

"Tiffin is incredible. We knew that coming in," Esposito said. "We get excited to run against them. I enjoy that competitiveness in the area."

"They help us get better. Ev-

erybody is looking for the same thing — to get down to state. Tiffin's depth makes them fun to compete against."

Esposito said the Giants can learn from the loss.

"It will instill confidence," she said. "Even second is a great learning experience for a young team. Losing by (a small margin) makes you more hungry."

Esposito said the team is more unified than past groups and the Clyde Invite could serve to close ranks even more.

"The sprinters cheer the distance runners and the distance group cheers the throwers," Esposito said. "They don't like to lose, and when they do they inquire about how it won't happen again. They like being winners and want to do what it takes to win."

Tim Burris won the high jump and was on the 1,600 relay for Ross.

"(Burris') experience has helped him to understand his events," Esposito said. "He's in specialized events where skill development comes into play. He's very talented in a lot of events. He's like a utility track athlete. He can score in a number of events.

"His technique has improved. The talent has always been there, but he's fine tuning things."

Clyde's Jared Martin matched his school record and established a meet mark with a 14.2 in the 110 hurdles. Martin also won the 300 hurdles and was second in the high jump.

"A strong crosswind wasn't helping me at all (in the 110 hurdles)," Martin said. "I feel stronger (this season). My form is better. I feel stronger between the hurdles and out of the blocks. Coaches have said I've matured. I feel like a different hurdler."

Martin set school marks in both hurdle events at the district meet last season and equaled

both at the Lakota Track Invitational on April 10.

"I come into meets confident," Martin said. "I try to visualize myself beating whoever I'm going to run against."

The Clyde girls finished fifth (53) as Upper Sandusky won with 116.

The Fliers' Meghan Gill won the 300 hurdles and was second in the high jump. Stephanie Meyer was second in the long jump, and Brianna Bradfield was sixth in the pole vault.

Bradfield won the pole vault against Margaretta earlier in the week, becoming the first Clyde girl to do so. She was actually the first Clyde girl to clear the bar in competition.

Flier coach Melanie Overmyer approached Bradfield to try the pole vault due to her background as a gymnast. Bradfield is awaiting the arrival of a new pole, one that isn't almost 20 pounds too heavy and two feet too long.

"I hit myself in the nose on Thursday and the forehead today," Bradfield said. "I started on Monday and I'm already at 7 feet. I have to learn the actual form."

Woodmore's Emily Pendelton won the discus and Ross's Ashley Fischer was second in the 1,600.

"(Fischer) thinks about her races," Esposito said. "She comes out harder. In the open mile, you have to think about strategy throughout the race."
