Ross hurdlers still alive

The Ross boys track team qualified two hurdlers to the finals of the Division I regionals at Amherst.

Brown, Salgado advance to state from Ross

Ross sophomore Deondray finished the 110-meter hurdles in 14.76 seconds for second at the Division I regional track meet Friday.

Julius Salgado also moved on to Columbus with a third-place finish in the 300 hurdles.

Ross track coach Cathy Esposito said Brown got out of the blocks without a hitch for a change.
