The Fremont Ross boys finished tied for second but took the spot on sixth-place finishers in a five-team cross country meet Tuesday at Hedges Boyer Park in Tiffin.

Host Columbian came out on top with Bowling Green third, Findlay fourth and Clay on the bottom.

In other boys meets Tuesday, Gibsonburg split in a double dual with Genoa and Otsego; Woodmore downed Lake; Oak Harbor was second in a quadrangular with Huron, Perkins and Sandusky; and Lakota was 1-2 in a triple dual with Fostoria, Eastwood and Elmwood.

In girls meets, Ross was fifth in the five-team meet at Hedges Boyer; Gibsonburg was 2-0 in a double dual with Otsego and Genoa; and Lakota was 2-1 in triple dual with Eastwood, Elmwood and Fostoria.

At Tiffin, host Columbian had 29 to the Little Giants' 59, the same as Bowling Green. Findlay had 82 and Oregon Clay 124.

Jay Ohms led Ross with a sixth-place finish in 18 minutes, four seconds. Derek Hill followed two places and 23 seconds later in 18:27.

Ross's sixth finisher was Micheal Flores (19:48). He placed 21st, three better than Bowling Green's sixth runner.
