# Ross Wins Sectional Baseball Turney

Although not bragging about their fielding performance the Ross Little Giants won the Fremont Class AA baseball sectional Monday afternoon at Anderson Field. The Little Giants stopped Port Clinton, 6-4, despite six Ross errors.

Ross batters were hitting the long ball but couldn't put them together for greater run production. Little Giants stroked for extra bases on five of their nine hits. Steve Fausey doubled. John Pasch, Bill Johnson and Larry Whatley all tripled.

It was the third pitching appearance for junior Chuck Ziemke and he gave up his first hits or runs of the season. After

starting the season with two no-hit shutouts, Ziemke gave up eight hits but held off Port Clinton when needed. He struck out eight and walked only one in posting his third victory without a loss.

The Little Giants now qualify for Sectional final play at North Robinson Wednesday. The Ross team is likely to play a survivor from Marion or Ashland for the right to advance to district play.

Tonight the Little Giants are at Lakota. Friday they are at home against Clyde and Saturday is a doubleheader at Perrysburg. The Buckeye Conference Western Division playoff, scheduled the past two Satur-

days but postponed, has been set back even further. Ross Coach Don Purvis said there is not likely to be an effort to play the league tournament until sectional and district tournaments are out of the way.

# ROSS PITCHER FACES ONLY 21 BATTERS IN SEVEN INNINGS

## Decker's No-Hitter Stops Marion, 1-0

NORTH ROBINSON — Scott Decker was near - perfect Wednesday afternoon and Fremont Ross needed just that kind of pitching performance. Decker faced only 21 men in seven innings as he threw a no - hit shutout. The mound mastery was the difference as Ross handed Marion its first defeat, 1-0.

In the first game of the Sectional finals at North Robinson Marion suffered defeat after 10 victories.

Decker allowed only one man to reach base when he hit Jim Velasquez, Marion third baseman, with a pitch in the fifth.

Decker then erased Velasquez on a perfect pickoff move. The base runner was caught leaning toward second. The Decker move was so perfect that Velasquez was caught six to eight feet off the bag.

"It is the only time in seven years of coaching I have seen a high school pitcher face only 21 batters," remarked Ross mentor Don Purvis. With his pitching mastery Decker erased the number one Marion weapon. In successfully stolen base on 41 of 42 attempts.

Decker hurled nine strikeouts and did not walk a man. The hit batsman was the only thing that stood in the way of a perfect game.

In the first six years of Purvis' coaching reign his Ross pitchers have recorded only one no - hit. That was by Mike Frantz in 1963. So far this year the Ross staff has turned in three no - hitters. Decker's is added to two by Junior Chuck Ziemke.

Ross managed only one run

despite seven hits and stranding nine men on base. The Little Giants went down with two men on base in each of the first four innings. The ninth man left on base came in the sixth inning.

The Little Giants scored their lone run in the second inning. Steve and Bill Fausey reached base on back - to - back infield hits. The next two men then went out on a pop-up and strikeout. Mac Whately lashed a double to drive in the one run of the game. The drive to left - center field was the first of two hits for Whately.

Defensively, Steve Fausey made a catch which saved the no - hit for Decker. He went into the hole between first and second to control the ball. It was one of 10 infield chances handled by the Little Giants. Only two balls were hit to the outfield against Decker.

In tournament play Ross returns to North Robinson Friday to meet Mansfield Madison. The winner will advance to District play. Madison won its section by topping Mansfield 21-0.

## Ross Falls To Madison

## Fremont Teams Eliminated In Tournaments

The sectional tournament trial ended in the finale Friday for both Fremont Ross and Fremont St. Joseph teams. One bad inning was the downfall of both teams in the sectional finals.

Three runs, two of them unearned, in one inning and a rain storm flooded out Ross' tournament hopes. The Little Giants fell to Mansfield Madison, 3-2, in a rain-abridged game at North Robinson.

Sandusky St. Mary collected six runs on five hits in the fifth inning to beat St. Joseph, 7-2, at Clyde.

The Ross game was called after five innings. It rained so hard the field was virtually under water before the umpires put an end to the game. Just before the rains in the bottom of the fifth inning Ross had men on second and third base with one out but could not score.

Chuck Ziemke was on the mound and the victim of the two unearned runs. The author of two no-hitters earlier in the season had set an end to the one-two-three order in the first, fourth and fifth innings. He had allowed a lead-off single in the third but then retired the next three men.

Madison scored all its runs in the second inning. A pop fly single over the infield, a strike out, walk and passed ball which third preceded a single by Brad Timkey which scored a triple, scored on Dennis Brudzinski's sacrifice, Bill Pickard singled, Dennis Knipp and Steve Fausey walked to load the bases with two out.
