Barberton Wins Track Title With One Entry

COLUMBUS — One man won the state Class A track meet for Barberton high school Saturday at Ohio State University.

Glenn Davis, a senior now competing at his third high school, was the only boy Coach S. J. Measell brought to the meet, and he scored 20 points, four more than the favored Mansfield squad.

The Class B championship was won by Nevada with 18 points Xenia Woodrow Wilson was second with 16.

Davis set a new state record in the 180-yard low hurdles with the time of 19.1 seconds, surpassing the record by one-fifth of a second. The old mark was set a year ago by Bill Whitman of Cleveland East Tech.

Libbey's Williams Wins

Davis, who was a freshman at Weirton, W. Va., and a sophomore at Marietta, O., before going to Barberton, also won the broad jump and 220. The orphan boy was rated a good chance in the 100-yard dash, but Toledo Libbey's brilliant sophomore, Roger Williams, ran it in 9.9 seconds, with Jack Covington of Columbus South second and Jim Tiller, of Fremont Ross, third. Davis was fourth.

(Tiller, the only Fremont entrant, ran the 100 in 10 seconds flat in Friday's qualifying race. He accounted for Fremont's three points).
